1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new subsection to section 15-10-17 of the North Dakota

2 Century Code, relating to the creation of a division of immigration within the state board of

3 higher education; and to amend and reenact section 4-01-20 of the North Dakota Century Code

4 and section 43 of Senate Bill No. 2032, relating to creation of a division of immigration within

5 the department of commerce.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 4-01-20 of the North Dakota Century Code is
 amended and reenacted as follows:

9 4-01-20. Commissioner Division of immigration to preserve records of

commissioner of immigration. All papers, writings, documents, books, records, files, and all
other papers of whatever nature, used by or in connection with the office of commissioner of
immigration, must be preserved by the commissioner of agriculture division of immigration.

SECTION 2. If Senate Bill No. 2032 does not become effective, a new subsection to
 section 15-10-17 of the 1999 Supplement to the North Dakota Century Code is created and
 enacted as follows:

16To establish and maintain a division of immigration to encourage and promote the17permanent settlement and improvement of all sections of the state. The division

18 <u>shall advertise the state and collect, classify, and distribute facts, statistics,</u>

19 pictures, and general information with reference to government and education;

20 social, industrial, and agricultural conditions; natural resources; opportunities and

21 advantages offered by the state as a place to live, especially its great advantages

- 22 for grain and stock raising and dairying; and to attract foreign and domestic
- 23 immigrants, settlers, investors, and industrial and economic development.

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1	SEC	CTION 3. Section 43 of Senate Bill No. 2032, as approved by the fifty-seventh			
2	legislative a	assembly, is amended and reenacted as follows:			
3	Definitions. In this chapter, unless the context or subject matter otherwise requires:				
4	1.	"Cabinet" means the North Dakota commerce cabinet.			
5	2.	"Commissioner" means the commissioner of commerce.			
6	3.	"Department" means the department of commerce.			
7	4.	"Division" means the division of immigration.			
8	<u>5.</u>	"Foundation" means the North Dakota economic development foundation.			
9	Department of commerce - Divisions. The North Dakota department of commerce is				
10	created. All records, materials, supplies, and equipment used by the division of community				
11	services, department of economic development and finance, and the department of tourism,				
12	and the agriculture commissioner as they relate to the commissioner of immigration are				
13	transferred to the department.				
14	1. The department must consist of:				
15		a. A division of community services;			
16		b. A division of economic development and finance;			
17		c. A division of tourism;			
18		d. A division of international trade;			
19		e. A division of workforce development; and			
20		f. <u>A division of immigration; and</u>			
21		g. Any division the commissioner determines necessary to carry out this chapter.			
22	2.	Each division director serves at the will of the commissioner and receives a salary			
23		set by the commissioner within the limits of legislative appropriations.			
24	Commissioner of commerce - Duties. With the advice and counsel of the North				
25	Dakota development foundation, the governor shall appoint a commissioner to supervise,				
26	control, and administer the department. The commissioner serves at the pleasure of the				
27	governor and receives a salary set by the governor within the limits of legislative appropriations.				
28	The commissioner:				
29	1.	Shall file an oath of office in the usual form before commencing to perform the			
30		duties of the commissioner;			
31	2.	Shall serve as chairman of the cabinet;			

1	3.	Shall prepare the cabinet's list identifying economic development moneys included
2		in budget requests of cabinet agencies;
3	4.	Shall appoint directors to administer each of the department divisions;
4	5.	Shall appoint personnel as may be determined necessary to carry out the duties of
5		the department;
6	6.	Shall manage the operations of the department and oversee each of the divisions;
7	7.	Shall assume central responsibilities to develop, implement, and coordinate a
8		working network of commerce service providers;
9	8.	Shall coordinate the department's services with commerce-related services of
10		other state agencies;
11	9.	Shall advise and cooperate with departments and agencies of the federal
12		government and of other states; private businesses, agricultural organizations, and
13		associations; and research institutions; and with any individual or other private or
14		public entity;
15	10.	May enter contracts upon terms and conditions as determined by the
16		commissioner to be reasonable and to effectuate the purposes of this chapter;
17	11.	Shall report between the first and tenth legislative days of each regular legislative
18		session to a standing committee of each house of the legislative assembly as
19		determined by the legislative council and shall report annually to the foundation on
20		the department's goals and objectives since the last report, on the department's
21		goals and objectives for the period until the next report, on the department's
22		long-term goals and objectives, and summarizing the department's activities and
23		measurable results occurring since the last report;
24	12.	Shall adopt rules necessary to implement this chapter; and
25	13.	Shall establish and maintain a division of immigration to encourage and promote
26		the permanent settlement and improvement of all sections of the state. The
27		division shall advertise the state and collect, classify, and distribute facts, statistics,
28		pictures, and general information with reference to government and education;
29		social, industrial, and agricultural conditions; natural resources; opportunities and
30		advantages offered by the state as a place to live, especially its great advantages

3	<u>14.</u>	May take any actions necessary and proper to implement this chapter.			
4	Nor	th Dakota economic development foundation - Executive committee -			
5	Purpose.	The North Dakota economic development foundation is created.			
6	1.	The foundation is composed of a minimum of fifteen and a maximum of thirty			
7		members appointed by the governor for two-year terms, except the governor shal	I		
8		appoint approximately one-half of the initial foundation members to one-year term	IS		
9		in order to initiate a cycle of staggered terms. Appointment of the foundation			
10		members must ensure a cross section of business and economic development			
11		representation.			
12	2.	The foundation members shall elect an executive committee with a minimum of five	ve		
13		and a maximum of nine foundation members. The executive committee members	3		
14		shall elect a chairman, vice chairman, and a secretary.			
15	3.	The purpose of the foundation is to:			
16		a. Provide the governor advice and counsel in selecting the commissioner;			
17		b. Serve in an advisory role to the commissioner, including counsel in the			
18		development of the division of economic development and finance's strategic	5		
19		plan;			
20		c. Monitor economic development activities and initiatives of the department;			
21		and			
22		d. Set accountability measurements for the department.			
23	4.	The foundation shall seek funding for administrative expenses from private sector			
24		sources and shall seek and distribute private sector funds for use in			
25		commerce-related activities in the state.			
26	Сог	mpensation and reimbursement of foundation members. The foundation may			
27	establish the level of compensation to which a foundation member is entitled. A foundation				
28	member is entitled to reimbursement for mileage and expenses as provided for state officers.				
29	Commerce cabinet. The North Dakota commerce cabinet is created. The cabinet is				
30	composed of the executive heads, or other authorized representatives, of the state board for				
31	vocational	and technical education, the state board of higher education, the Bank of North			

1 Dakota, the department of agriculture, the workers compensation bureau, and of any other state

2 agency appointed by the commissioner. The commissioner is the chairman of the cabinet and

- 3 shall determine which agencies are members of the cabinet. The cabinet shall:
- Coordinate and communicate economic development efforts of the agencies
 represented.
- 6 2. Meet a minimum of four times and a maximum of twelve times each year.
- 7 3. Develop and make available before each regular session of the legislative
 8 assembly a list that identifies economic development moneys included in budget
 9 requests of cabinet agencies.

10 **Cooperation with other agencies or private entities to jointly publish or mail**

11 **publications.** The department may cooperate with other state agencies or with a private entity

- 12 for the purpose of jointly publishing or distributing information or publications as provided in
- 13 section 54-06-04.3.
