- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 15-40.1-07.7 of the North Dakota Century
- 2 Code or in the alternative to amend and reenact section 15.1-27-12 of the North Dakota
- 3 Century Code, relating to the payments for limited English proficient students.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

5 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. If House Bill No. 1045 does not become effective, section
6 15-40.1-07.7 of the 1999 Supplement to the North Dakota Century Code is amended and
7 reenacted as follows:

16			student's school district and determined found to have negligible or very
17			limited English language skills, as evidenced by a classification of level \ensuremath{For} II
18			using the Woodcock-Munoz language survey.
19		<u>C.</u>	Three hundred dollars for each student who has been assessed by the
20			student's school district and found to have limited English language skills, as
21			evidenced by a classification of level III using the Woodcock-Munoz language
22			survey.

5	2.	In order to be eligible for assessment under this section, a student:
6		a. Must be at least five years of age but must not have reached the age of
7		twenty-two;
8		b. Must be enrolled in a school district in this state;
9		c. Must have a primary language other than English; and
10		d. Must have difficulty speaking, reading, writing, and understanding English.
11	<u>3.</u>	In order to be eligible for the payment provided for in this section, a school district
12		must provide an approved program of instruction for students who have negligible
13		limited English language skills, very limited English language skills, or limited
14		English language skills. In order to receive the full payment provided for in this
15		section, a school district must complete the student assessment required by
16		subsection 1 and forward the results to the superintendent of public instruction on
17		or before October twenty fifth December first of each school year. The
18		superintendent shall distribute the payments no later than May thirtieth of each
19		school year. The superintendent shall prorate payments under this section for any
20		students registering in the school district after October first the start of the school
21		year or departing from the school district prior to the completion of the school year.
