1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact eight new sections to chapter 36-14 of the North Dakota

2 Century Code, relating to indemnity for diseased animals; to amend and reenact section

3 36-15-08.1 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to indemnity payments for animals

4 diagnosed with brucellosis or bovine tuberculosis; and to repeal sections 36-15-03, 36-15-04,

5 36-15-06, 36-15-07, 36-15-09, and 36-15-11 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to

6 appraisals and condemnation of animals having brucellosis or bovine tuberculosis.

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

8 **SECTION 1.** A new section to chapter 36-14 of the North Dakota Century Code is

9 created and enacted as follows:

10 **Definitions.** In this chapter, unless the context otherwise requires:

<u>1.</u> <u>"Animals" means alpaca, bison, bovine animals, farmed elk, goats, horses, llamas,</u>
 sheep, swine, and nontraditional livestock.

13 <u>2.</u> <u>"Board" means the state board of animal health.</u>

SECTION 2. A new section to chapter 36-14 of the North Dakota Century Code is
created and enacted as follows:

16 Notice of condemnation of diseased animal - Animal to be destroyed within

17 fifteen days - Extension of time. Whenever any animal has been adjudged by the board to

18 be diseased, the board or its authorized agent shall serve a written notice of its decision upon

19 the owner or keeper of the animal before the condemned animal is killed. The animal must be

20 destroyed within fifteen days after notice of condemnation, in either a federally inspected or

21 state-inspected slaughtering plant, or under the supervision of an agent of the board. The

22 fifteen-day period may be extended by the state veterinarian if the state veterinarian determines

23 it advisable due to the circumstances involved in each case. The extension must be in writing.

24 The notice must advise the animal's owner or keeper of that person's right to protest against

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1	the diagnosis and determination of the board within twenty-four hours after the service of the		
2	notice upon the owner or keeper. If no protest is made within that time by the owner or keeper		
3	of the condemned animal, the animal must be appraised in the manner provided in this chapter.		
4	SECTION 3. A new section to chapter 36-14 of the North Dakota Century Code is		
5	created and enacted as follows:		
6	Animal condemned as diseased to be appraised by board - Notice to owner.		
7	<u>1.</u>	Whenever any animal has been adjudged to be diseased and ordered killed by the	
8		board, the board or its authorized agent, within seven days after the entry of the	
9		order and before the animal has been killed pursuant to the order, shall determine	
10		the actual value of the animal. Notice of the appraisal must be given to the owner	
11		or keeper of the animal.	
12	<u>2.</u>	If an emergency is declared by the governor, the board shall conduct any appraisal	
13		required by this section within twenty-four hours and may destroy the animal as	
14		soon thereafter as practicable. The owner may not protest the appraisal. The	
15		owner may consent in writing to an earlier destruction of the animal.	
16	SECTION 4. A new section to chapter 36-14 of the North Dakota Century Code is		
17	created and enacted as follows:		
18	Protest of board's appraisal - Board of appraisers appointed - Appraisal to be		
19	final. Except as provided in section 3, if any individual who owns or who represents the owner		
20	of any animal ordered killed under this chapter is not satisfied with the appraisal by the board or		
21	its agents, the individual may protest the order, and a board of three appraisers must then be		
22	formed. One member of the board of appraisers must be the agent of the board, one member		
23	must be selected by the owner of the animal involved, and the third member must be selected		
24	by the first two members. An appraisal of the animal must be made by the board of appraisers		
25	according to section 7 of this Act, and if two or more of the appraisers agree upon a certain		
26	valuation, the appraisal is final.		
27	SE	CTION 5. A new section to chapter 36-14 of the North Dakota Century Code is	
28	created and enacted as follows:		
29	Fees of appraisers - How paid. Each member of the board of appraisers who is not		
30	an agent of the board is entitled to receive fifty dollars per day as compensation for services		
31	rendered, plus reimbursement for expenses as provided by law for state officers. Fifty percent		

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1 of the amount due under this section is payable by the state board of animal health and the 2 other fifty percent is payable by the owner of the animal. 3 SECTION 6. A new section to chapter 36-14 of the North Dakota Century Code is 4 created and enacted as follows: Approval of indemnity payments - Rules. If the board determines that an animal is 5 6 so seriously diseased as to warrant disposal of the animal and of all other exposed animals, the 7 board may approve indemnity payments, as funds are appropriated, on the animals in 8 accordance with the limits set in section 7 of this Act. The board may adopt rules governing 9 indemnity payments under this chapter. 10 SECTION 7. A new section to chapter 36-14 of the North Dakota Century Code is 11 created and enacted as follows: 12 **Return of appraisal - Payment of claims for diseased animals.** The return of an 13 appraisal under this chapter must be in writing and signed by the board or by the board's agent 14 who made the appraisal, or by the members of the board of appraisers if a reappraisal is made 15 after a protest, and by the owner of the condemned animal. The return must be certified by the 16 agriculture commissioner to the office of management and budget. The office of management 17 and budget shall issue a check jointly to the owner and any lienholders of the animal. The 18 amount of indemnity paid by this state to the owner of a diseased animal may not exceed five 19 thousand dollars per animal less any amount obtained by the owner through insurance, federal 20 indemnity payments, or salvage payments. This state is not liable for indemnity under this 21 chapter in excess of the amount approved by the emergency commission for the payment of 22 the indemnity. 23 **SECTION 8.** A new section to chapter 36-14 of the North Dakota Century Code is 24 created and enacted as follows: 25 **Owner of diseased animals - No indemnification - Circumstances.** The right of the 26 owner of a diseased animal to be indemnified does not exist and the board may not authorize 27 payment if: 28 The animal belongs to the United States, to this state, or to any political 1. 29 subdivision of this state. 30 2. The owner at the time of coming into possession of the animal knew or suspected 31 it to be diseased.

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1	<u>3.</u>	The animal was found to have been clinically diseased at the time of its arrival in
2		this state.
3	<u>4.</u>	The owner is a nonresident and not engaged in the breeding of livestock in this
4		state.
5	<u>5.</u>	The animal at the time of its killing had been in this state for less than six months.
6	<u>6.</u>	The owner of an animal willfully exposed the animal to the disease.
7	<u>7.</u>	The owner violated any law or any rule of the board.
8	SEC	CTION 9. AMENDMENT. Section 36-15-08.1 of the 1999 Supplement to the North
9	Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

16	set forth in section 36-15-09 <u>7 of this Act</u> . The board may make reasonable <u>adopt</u> rules	
17	governing the payment of such compensation within the limits prescribed in indemnity	
18	payments under this chapter.	
19	SEC	CTION 10. REPEAL. Sections 36-15-03, 36-15-04, 36-15-06, 36-15-07, 36-15-09,
20	and 36-15-	11 of the North Dakota Century Code are repealed.
