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- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 40-47-06 of the North Dakota Century Code,
- 2 relating to appointments of zoning commissions.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 40-47-06 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
- 40-47-06. Zoning commission Appointment Duties Preliminary and final report.
  - The governing body of a city desiring to avail itself of the powers conferred by this chapter shall appoint a commission, to be known as the zoning commission, to recommend the boundaries of the various original districts and appropriate regulations to be enforced therein. In addition to the members appointed by the city, the zoning commission shall include at least one person residing outside of the corporate limits of a city having a population of less than five thousand, two persons residing outside the corporate limits of a city having a population of five thousand or more, but less than twenty-five thousand, or three persons residing outside the corporate limits of a city having a population of twenty five thousand or more if zoning authority is exercised pursuant to section 40-47-01.1. Such persons shall be appointed by the board or boards of county commissioners of the county or counties within which such zoning authority is to be exercised and shall reside within the territorial limits of the zoning regulation authority exercised by the city, if such persons are available and will serve on the zoning commission. Of the members of the commission appointed by a board or boards of county commissioners pursuant to this section, the first member appointed shall hold office for five years, the second member appointed shall hold office for three years,

- and the third member appointed shall hold office for one year. Thereafter, the members shall be appointed for terms of five years. Such A zoning commission shall make a preliminary report and hold public hearings thereon before submitting its a final report. The governing body shall may not hold its public hearings or take action until it has received the final report of the zoning commission. If a city has a planning commission, it may be appointed as the zoning commission.
- 2. If a city exercises extraterritorial zoning authority under section 40-47-01.1, the city shall enter an agreement to share zoning decisionmaking authority with the county or township that previously had exercised zoning authority in the area over which the city is exercising extraterritorial zoning authority. If the city zoning commission proposes consideration of a zoning matter concerning an area over which it has extraterritorial zoning authority, the commission shall notify the zoning commission of the county or township that previously had exercised zoning authority over that area. After providing notice, as provided in section 40-47-04, of a joint hearing, the zoning commissions shall hold a public hearing at which interested parties may have an opportunity to be heard. Before a zoning regulation may be implemented or amended which affects the area over which the city has extraterritorial zoning authority, each zoning commission and governing body involved must, by a majority vote of each entity, approve the regulation.
