4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. A new section to chapter 54-56 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows:

Community child care grant program. The children's services coordinating committee, through the regional and tribal children's services coordinating committees and in collaboration with the state's child care resource and referral agencies, shall establish a community child care grant program. The committee shall appoint a ten-member statewide community child care review committee to determine the criteria for awarding grants under the program. The community child care review committee must be composed of three representatives of child care resource and referral agencies; three representatives of the regional and tribal children's services coordinating committees; the administrators of the early childhood services and the head start collaboration programs of the children and family services division of the department of human services; and two individuals selected by the children's services coordinating committee who represent the early childhood professional community. The administration costs of the program may not exceed five percent of the total allocations to the state. A grant application process must be used for awarding grants and an individual grant may not exceed five thousand dollars. The following criteria must be met to be eligible for a grant under the program:

 A one hundred percent match from a local funding source. Public funds, excluding state funds, private funds, and in-kind donations may be used to meet the matching requirement.

8	SEC	OIT	2. APPROPRIATION. There is appropriated from special funds derived from
9	federal funds and other income, the sum of \$500,000, or so much of the sum as may be		
10	necessary, to the children's services coordinating committee for the purpose of establishing a		
11	community child care grant program and for providing grants under the program, for the		
12	biennium beginning July 1, 2001, and ending June 30, 2003.
