- 14 4-10-06.1. Seed potatoes Certification requirement.

- 1. A person may not plant seed potatoes in lots of one acre [.405 hectare] or more, for the purpose of selling the crop to be harvested, unless the seed potatoes have:
 - <u>a.</u> Have been certified by the commissioner as meeting the standards of this chapter, have;
 - <u>b.</u> Have been certified by another state or province having a similar seed potato quality assurance program; or have
 - <u>c.</u> <u>Have</u> been field-inspected and approved by the commissioner. However, the

- 3. The commissioner shall permit a North Dakota grower to sell or otherwise transfer certified seed to another North Dakota grower once each year. The recipient grower may plant the seed only for commercial production. The recipient grower may not replant the seed for recertification purposes.
- 4. If the commissioner has reason to believe that seed potatoes meeting the requirements of this section are not available in sufficient quantities to fulfill planting needs, the commissioner may permit the planting of seed potatoes with a higher disease content, provided that bacterial ring rot is not present and that a serious disease threat is not posed.
