2 50-year projections of the delivery of health care services in the state, including the capacity,

3 distribution, and accessibility of the system of providing health services; the changing dynamics

4 of delivery of health services; possible health care services strategies to better serve residents;

5 and the role of health care services in future development in this state.

6 WHEREAS, health services are delivered through a broad range of providers, including
7 private providers, not-for-profit providers, and through federal, state, and local governments;

9 WHEREAS, the method of delivery of health services has changed dramatically over
10 the past generation and will likely change dramatically over the next generation; and

11 WHEREAS, the changing demographics of the state, including the average age and

12 geographic distribution of residents, impacts the health services needs of North Dakotans; and

WHEREAS, providing health care services to residents improves the quality of life and
is a development incentive;

15 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES
 16 OF NORTH DAKOTA, THE SENATE CONCURRING THEREIN:

17 That the Legislative Council study current and 5-, 10-, 25-, and 50-year projections of 18 the delivery of health care services in the state, including the capacity, distribution, and 19 accessibility of the system of providing health services; the changing dynamics of delivery of 20 health services; possible health care services strategies to better serve residents; and the role 21 of health care services in future development in this state; and 22 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that the Legislative Council report its findings and

recommendations, together with any legislation required to implement the recommendations, to
 the Fifty-eighth Legislative Assembly.
