1 A concurrent resolution directing the Legislative Council to study the issues and concerns of 2 implementing charitable choice, the privatization of federally funded welfare services through 3 faith-based organizations. 4 WHEREAS, "charitable choice" is the term applied to Section 104 of the federal welfare reform law, the Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act of 1996 5 6 [Pub. L. 104-193; 110 Stat. 2105], which encourages states to involve charitable, religious, or 7 private organizations in providing federally funded welfare services to the poor and needy; and 8 WHEREAS, charitable choice allows states to enter purchase of service agreements or 9 voucher arrangements with charitable, religious, or private organizations under the temporary 10 assistance for needy families program; and 11 WHEREAS, charitable choice also applies to supplemental security income and to the 12 food stamp and Medicaid programs to the extent that the state uses contracts or vouchers with 13 nongovernmental providers; and 14 WHEREAS, proponents of charitable choice claim that states have long contracted with 15 private and religious groups to provide programs like job training, foster care, child-rearing 16 classes, adult education, day care, and drug rehabilitation and that charities reduce 17 administrative costs by using volunteers and lower-paid employees; and 18 WHEREAS, opponents claim charitable choice violates the separation of church and 19 state by allowing pervasively sectarian institutions, including houses of worship, to receive 20 federal funding to administer social services and public health benefits on behalf of the 21 government; 22 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF NORTH DAKOTA, THE
