ENGROSSED SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 4026

1	A concurrent resolution urging Congress to carefully examine United States agricultural policy
2	with a view to addressing trade and export enhancement issues, adequate loan rates for all
3	commodities, and any other issues or provisions that would restore income protection and
4	prosperity for this country's farmers.
5	WHEREAS, the prices for many commodities grown by farmers in this state have for
6	several years been at historically low levels; and
7	WHEREAS, the prices received by farmers for their commodities are often lower than
8	the actual cost of production; and
9	WHEREAS, emergency government assistance payments to farmers in this state have
10	over the last three years exceeded \$1 billion; and
11	WHEREAS, in 1996, government subsidies accounted for 13 percent of total farm
12	income; and
13	WHEREAS, in 1999, government subsidies accounted for 42 percent of total farm
14	income; and
15	WHEREAS, statistics released by the Food and Agricultural Policy Research Institute at
16	the University of Missouri indicate that if the current agricultural policy is not changed, net farm
17	income will by the year 2009 fall to \$37 billion, which is \$17 billion less than the 1996 level; and
18	WHEREAS, the European Union assists its farmers through high-support prices and
19	generous direct payments, which result in prosperous rural areas and a vibrant agricultural
20	economy; and
21	WHEREAS, this country's agricultural policy frequently fails to provide adequate
22	protection from market downturns;
23	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF NORTH DAKOTA,
24	THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING THEREIN:

That the Fifty-seventh Legislative Assembly urges the Congress of the United States to
carefully examine United States agricultural policy with a view to addressing trade and export
enhancement issues, adequate loan rates for all commodities, and any other issues or
provisions that would restore income protection and prosperity for this country's farmers; and

resolution to the President of the United States, the majority and minority leaders of the United
States Senate and the House of Representatives, the chairman of the Senate Agriculture
