**ENGROSSED SENATE CONCURRENT  
RESOLUTION NO. 4043**

1 A concurrent resolution directing the Legislative Council to study the feasibility and desirability  
2 of promoting carbon sequestration programs in this state.

3 **WHEREAS**, carbon dioxide emissions from manmade activities account for  
4 approximately four percent of total carbon dioxide emissions worldwide; and

5 **WHEREAS**, while the scientific community continues to debate the causation and  
6 extent of global warming from increased carbon dioxide emissions, it is prudent to take actions  
7 that reduce carbon dioxide emissions under voluntary, no-regrets policies; and

8 **WHEREAS**, many plants absorb carbon dioxide and deposit, sequester, or sink carbon  
9 into the soil, thus removing it from the atmosphere; and

10 **WHEREAS**, carbon dioxide producing industries may be willing to pay farmers and  
11 ranchers to plant crops and use land-management practices that will sequester carbon on their  
12 land; and

13 **WHEREAS**, recently 400 farmers in Iowa were paid \$8 million for storing carbon; and

14 **WHEREAS**, it has been estimated that South Dakota farmers could receive \$20 to \$30  
15 an acre for cultivated land and three to five dollars an acre for rangeland for capturing or  
16 sequestering carbon on their land; and

17 **WHEREAS**, carbon sequestration may provide a much-needed source of additional  
18 income for this state's farmers and ranchers;

19 **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF NORTH DAKOTA,**  
20 **THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING THEREIN:**

21 That the Legislative Council study the feasibility and desirability of promoting carbon  
22 sequestration programs in this state; and

23 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that the Legislative Council report its findings and  
24 recommendations, together with any legislation required to implement the recommendations, to  
25 the Fifty-eighth Legislative Assembly.
