ENGROSSED HOUSE BILL NO. 1012

(At the request of the Governor)

- 1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the department of
- 2 human services; to provide for the transfer of appropriation authority between agencies and
- 3 institutions; to provide for a legislative council study; to provide statements of legislative intent;
- 4 to provide an exception to section 54-16-04 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to
- 5 emergency commission approval for line item transfers; to provide for basic care facility rates;
- 6 to create and enact a new subsection to section 50-10-06 of the North Dakota Century Code,
- 7 relating to eligibility for children's special health services; to amend and reenact subsection 2 of
- 8 section 25-02-01.1 and subsection 3 of section 50-01.2-03.2 of the North Dakota Century
- 9 Code, relating to compensation for members of the state hospital governing board and county
- 10 reimbursements; and to declare an emergency.

11 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION. The funds provided in this section, or so much of the funds as may be necessary, are appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from special funds derived from federal funds and other income, to the department of human services and its various divisions, for the purpose of defraying their expenses, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2001, and ending June 30, 2003,

18	SECTION 2. LANDS AND MINERALS TRUST FUND. T	he amount of \$2,261,556, or
19	so much of the sum as may be necessary, as appropriated in the developmentally disabled	
20	facility loan fund line item in section 1 of this Act, may be expended by the department of	
21	human services from the lands and minerals trust fund for the purpose of making payments of	
22	principal and interest to the common schools trust fund on any loans made from it pursuant to	
23	the developmentally disabled loan fund program nos. 2 and 3 for the biennium beginning	
24	July 1, 2001, and ending June 30, 2003.	
25	SECTION 3. DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES REVOL	VING LOAN FUND. There
26	may be expended by the department of human services, on or before June 1, 2003, from the	
27	cash balance of, any payments deposited in, the revolving loan fund created under section	
28	6-09.6-01, the sum of \$871,765, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, which is	
29	appropriated in section 1 of this Act.	

1 **SECTION 4. TRANSFER.** Subject to the provisions of chapter 54-16, the director of 2 the department of human services may transfer appropriation authority between agencies and 3 institutions included in subdivisions 1 through 4 of section 1 of this Act. 4 SECTION 5. CORRELATION OF RESOURCES FOR DEPARTMENTAL CLIENTS. 5 Notwithstanding section 4 of this Act, the director of the department of human services may 6 transfer appropriation authority and authorized positions between agencies and institutions 7 included within subdivision 4 of section 1 of this Act to correlate fiscal and staff resources with 8 the flow of institutional residents and human service center clients between community-based 9 programs and institutions. The transfers from human service centers require prior consultation 10 with the regional human service center advisory boards. 11 SECTION 6. ALCOHOL AND DRUG EDUCATION PROGRAM - EXPENDITURE -12 **LIMITATIONS.** The moneys appropriated in the grants line item in subdivision 3 of section 1 of 13 this Act for the native American alcohol and drug abuse education program may not be spent 14 for the services provided by the tribes to administer the program. The local grant recipient is 15 required to provide matching equal to the grant amount with funding or in-kind service. 16 SECTION 7. DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES - FUNDING OR EMPLOYEE 17 TRANSFERS - REPORT TO FIFTY-EIGHTH LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY. The department of 18 human services shall prepare and present a report to the appropriations committees of the 19 fifty-eighth legislative assembly on any transfers of funding or employee full-time equivalent 20 positions made between the department's subdivisions or institutions and human service 21 centers during the biennium beginning July 1, 2001, and ending June 30, 2003. 22 **SECTION 8. LINE ITEM TRANSFER AUTHORITY.** Notwithstanding section 54-16-04, 23 the department of human services may transfer amounts of up to \$250,000 from the operating 24 expenses line item in subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act to the equipment line item in 25 subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act for the biennium beginning July 1, 2001, and ending 26 June 30, 2003. The department shall notify the office of management and budget of each 27 transfer. 28 SECTION 9. LEGISLATIVE INTENT - MEDICAL SERVICES - UTILIZATION 29 **REVIEW.** It is the intent of the legislative assembly that the department of human services 30 enhance the effectiveness of its utilization review efforts in the medical services program during 31 the biennium beginning July 1, 2001, and ending June 30, 2003.

1 SECTION 10. LEGISLATIVE INTENT - DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES -2 **SHARING OF WORKSTATIONS.** It is the intent of the legislative assembly that the 3 department of human services consider requiring the sharing of workstations by its employees 4 for the biennium beginning July 1, 2001, and ending June 30, 2003. 5 SECTION 11. LEGISLATIVE INTENT - DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES -6 **TELEPHONE COST-SAVINGS.** It is the intent of the legislative assembly that the department 7 of human services consider distributing prepaid telephone calling cards to its employees for use 8 when making allowable long-distance personal telephone calls when traveling on official state 9 business during the biennium beginning July 1, 2001, and ending June 30, 2003. 10 SECTION 12. LEGISLATIVE INTENT - DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES -11 PRINTING COST-SAVINGS. It is the intent of the legislative assembly that the department of 12 human services consider expanding its use of e-mail for distributing information to reduce 13 printing costs for the biennium beginning July 1, 2001, and ending June 30, 2003. 14 SECTION 13. LEGISLATIVE INTENT - GENERAL FUND AND HEALTH CARE TRUST FUND MONEYS - SPENDING PRIORITY. It is the intent of the legislative assembly 15 16 that for any programs receiving appropriations from both the general fund and health care trust 17 fund, the department of human services spend moneys appropriated from the general fund 18 before spending moneys from the health care trust fund for the biennium beginning July 1, 19 2001, and ending June 30, 2003. 20 SECTION 14. LEGISLATIVE INTENT - STATE HOSPITAL LANDFILL CLOSURE. It 21 is the intent of the legislative assembly that the state hospital seek the assistance of the 22 adjutant general in the closure of the state hospital landfill and that the adjutant general 23 complete the project subject to the approval of the associated general contractors of North 24 Dakota for the biennium beginning July 1, 2001, and ending June 30, 2003. 25 SECTION 15. LEGISLATIVE INTENT - FEDERAL FAMILY CAREGIVER FUNDS. It 26 is the intent of the legislative assembly that the department of human services determine the 27 requirements related to the acceptance of federal family caregiver funds, including allowable 28 uses, maintenance of effort, and future funding projections. 29 SECTION 16. LEGISLATIVE INTENT - PAYMENT SCHEDULE FOR CRITICAL 30 **ACCESS HOSPITALS.** It is the intent of the legislative assembly that the department of

- 1 human services implement a charge-based payment schedule for critical access hospitals, for 2 the biennium beginning July 1, 2001, and ending June 30, 2003. 3 SECTION 17. LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL STUDY - STATE ADMINISTRATION OF 4 **CHILD SUPPORT.** The legislative council shall consider studying, during the 2001-02 interim, 5 the feasibility and desirability of state administration of child support, including the fiscal effect 6 on counties and the state. The legislative council shall report its findings and 7 recommendations, together with any legislation required to implement the recommendations, to 8 the fifty-eighth legislative assembly. 9 SECTION 18. COMPULSIVE GAMBLING SERVICES - CONTINGENT FUNDING. 10 The operating expenses line item in subdivision 3 of section 1 of this Act includes \$150,000 11 from the general fund for compulsive gambling services. The department of human services 12 may spend \$50,000 of this funding for compulsive gambling services only if the mental health 13 association of North Dakota certifies to the department of human services that it has received 14 at least \$220,000 of funding from Indian gaming sources for compulsive gambling services 15 during the biennium beginning July 1, 2001, and ending June 30, 2003. 16 SECTION 19. STATE HOSPITAL LANDFILL CLOSURE - PROJECTED SAVINGS. 17 During the second year of the biennium beginning July 1, 2001, and ending June 30, 2003, the 18 state hospital may use projected savings from other areas of the state hospital budget for the 19 costs of closing the state hospital landfill. The state hospital may transfer appropriation 20 authority between line items to provide the funding needed for the project, subject to 21 emergency commission and budget section approval. 22 **SECTION 20.** Basic care facility private room rates. The department of human 23 services shall allow a basic care facility to charge a higher rate for a private room used by a 24 recipient of benefits under chapter 50-24.5 if the private room is not necessary to meet the 25 resident's care needs; the resident, or a person acting on behalf of the resident, has requested 26 the private room and the facility informs the person making the request, at the time of the 27 request, of the amount of payment and that the payment must come from sources other than a 28 resident's monthly income; and the payment does not exceed the amount charged to private 29 pay residents.
- 30 SECTION 21. AMENDMENT. Subsection 2 of section 25-02-01.1 of the 1999 Supplement to the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

- Legislative Assembly 1 2. The department, in consultation with the state hospital, shall create a state hospital 2 governing body and shall by rules describe the powers and duties of the governing 3 body. The department shall compensate members not employed by the 4 department in the amount of sixty-two one hundred dollars and fifty cents per day 5 and reimburse members for expenses incurred in attending meetings in the 6 amounts provided by sections 44-08-04 and 54-06-09. 7 SECTION 22. AMENDMENT. Subsection 3 of section 50-01.2-03.2 of the North 8 Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows: 9 3. Notwithstanding any other provisions of law, the department shall reimburse 10 county social service boards for expenses of locally administered economic 11 assistance programs in counties in which more than twenty percent of the 12
 - caseload for these programs consists of people who reside on a federally recognized Indian reservation or property tax-exempt tribal trust lands. The reimbursement must be such that:
 - An affected county's expenses for locally administered economic assistance programs in excess of the statewide average of such costs, expressed in mills, for all other counties will be reimbursed at one hundred ninety-three percent;
 - Each calendar year the affected counties will receive quarterly allocations b. based on the actual county expenses for the state fiscal year ending the previous June thirtieth and the most recent taxable valuations published pursuant to section 57-13-07 available on that date; and
 - The reimbursement will be calculated for each county and reported to the C. county social service board prior to August first of the year preceding the allocation; and.
 - d. For calendar year 2000, up to fifteen percent of the social service block grant funds available to all counties during that calendar year or general fund equivalents of social service block grant funds must be used for part of this reimbursement. For the first six months of calendar year 2001, up to seven and one-half percent of the social service block grant funds available to all

1	counties during that calendar year or general fund equivalents of social
2	service block grant funds must be used for part of this reimbursement.
3	SECTION 23. A new subsection to section 50-10-06 of the North Dakota Century Code
4	is created and enacted as follows:
5	Establish eligibility criteria for services under this chapter at one hundred
6	eighty-five percent of the poverty line, except for criteria relating to phenylketonuria
7	treatment services for which income is not to be considered when determining
8	eligibility. For purposes of this chapter, "poverty line" has the same meaning as
9	defined in section 50-29-01.
10	SECTION 24. EMERGENCY. Section 20 of this Act is declared to be an emergency
11	measure. The department of human services shall authorize the basic care facility private
12	room rate through emergency rulemaking.
