

SENATE BILL NO. 2015

Introduced by

Appropriations Committee

(At the request of the Governor)

1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the state industrial
2 commission and the agencies under the management of the industrial commission; to provide a
3 continuing appropriation; to authorize transfers; and to declare an emergency.

4 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:**

5 **SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION.** The funds provided in this section, or so much of the
6 funds as may be necessary, are hereby appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in
7 the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from special funds derived from federal
8 funds and other income, to the state industrial commission and agencies under its control for
9 the purpose of defraying the expenses of their various divisions, for the biennium beginning
10 July 1, 2001, and ending June 30, 2003, as follows:

1 **SECTION 2. APPROPRIATION.** In addition to the amount appropriated to the housing
2 finance agency in subdivision 5 of section 1 of this Act, there is hereby appropriated any
3 additional income or unanticipated income from federal or other funds which may become
4 available to the agency for the biennium beginning July 1, 2001, and ending June 30, 2003.

5 **SECTION 3. APPROPRIATION - EMERGENCY COMMISSION APPROVAL.** In
6 addition to the amount appropriated to the industrial commission in subdivision 1 of section 1 of
7 this Act, there is hereby appropriated, with the approval of the emergency commission, funds
8 that may become available to the commission from bonds authorized by law to be issued by the
9 industrial commission under chapters 4-36 and 54-17.2 and section 54-17-25, for the biennium
10 beginning July 1, 2001, and ending June 30, 2003.

11 **SECTION 4. TRANSFER.** The sum of \$65,447, or so much of the sum as may be
12 necessary, included in the special funds appropriation line item in subdivision 1 of section 1 of
13 this Act, is from the North Dakota mill and elevator association. The moneys must be
14 transferred during the biennium beginning July 1, 2001, and ending June 30, 2003, upon order
15 of the industrial commission.

16 **SECTION 5. TRANSFER.** The sum of \$85,403, or so much of the sum as may be
17 necessary, included in the special funds appropriation line item in subdivision 1 of section 1 of
18 this Act, is from the accumulated and undivided profits of the Bank of North Dakota. The
19 moneys must be transferred during the biennium beginning July 1, 2001, and ending June 30,
20 2003, upon order of the industrial commission.

21 **SECTION 6. TRANSFER.** The sum of \$56,936, or so much of the sum as may be
22 necessary, included in the special funds appropriation line item in subdivision 1 of section 1 of
23 this Act, is from the housing finance agency fund. The moneys must be transferred during the
24 biennium beginning July 1, 2001, and ending June 30, 2003, upon order of the industrial
25 commission.

26 **SECTION 7. TRANSFER.** The sum or \$19,957, or so much of the sum as may be
27 necessary, included in the special funds appropriation line item in subdivision 1 of section 1 of
28 this Act, is from the revenues of the municipal bond bank. The available moneys must be
29 transferred during the biennium beginning July 1, 2001, and ending June 30, 2003, upon order
30 of the industrial commission.

1 **SECTION 8. INCOME AUTHORIZATION - STUDENT LOAN TRUST.** There is hereby
2 authorized the receipt of fees by the industrial commission in the sum of \$75,550, or so much of
3 the sum as is owed, included in the special funds appropriation line item in subdivision 1 of
4 section 1 of this Act, from the student loan trust for administrative services rendered by the
5 industrial commission to the extent permitted by sections 54-17-24 and 54-17-25. The fees
6 must be received during the biennium beginning July 1, 2001, and ending June 30, 2003, upon
7 order of the industrial commission.

8 **SECTION 9. TRANSFER.** The industrial commission shall transfer to the general fund
9 in the state treasury, the sum of \$6,000,000 from the North Dakota mill and elevator
10 association. The moneys must be transferred in amounts and at such times as requested by
11 the director of the office of management and budget during the biennium beginning July 1,
12 2001, and ending June 30, 2003.

13 **SECTION 10. LIGNITE RESEARCH, DEVELOPMENT, AND MARKETING**
14 **PROGRAM - APPROPRIATION - LIGNITE MARKETING FEASIBILITY STUDY.** The amount
15 of \$1,300,000, or so much of the amount as may be necessary, included in the grants and
16 special funds appropriation line items in subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act, is appropriated
17 from the lignite research fund for the purpose of contracting for independent, nonmatching
18 lignite marketing feasibility study or studies that determine those focused priority areas where
19 near-term, market-driven projects, activities, or processes will generate matching private
20 industry investment and have the most potential of preserving existing lignite production and
21 jobs or that will lead to increased development of lignite and its products and create new jobs
22 and economic growth for the general welfare of this state. Moneys appropriated pursuant to
23 this section may also be used for the purpose of contracting for nonmatching studies and
24 activities in support of the Lignite Vision 21 Project; or other marketing or environmental
25 activities that assist with marketing of lignite-based electricity; and lignite-based byproducts.
26 Moneys not needed for the purposes stated herein are available to the commission for funding
27 projects, processes, or activities under the lignite research, development, and marketing
28 program.

29 **SECTION 11. LEGISLATIVE INTENT - LEASE PAYMENTS.** The amount of
30 \$17,956,059 included in subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act in the bond payments line item

1 must be paid from the following funding sources during the biennium beginning July 1, 2001,
2 and ending June 30, 2003:

14 **SECTION 12. APPROPRIATION - TRANSFER.** The funds appropriated by
15 subdivision 3 of section 1 of this Act must be transferred by the Bank of North Dakota to the
16 partnership in assisting community expansion fund established by section 6-09.14-02; the
17 agricultural partnership in assisting community expansion fund established by section
18 6-09.13-04; and the beginning farmer loan fund established by section 6-09.15.5; in the
19 amounts set out in that subdivision. The Bank of North Dakota may not be construed to be a
20 general fund agency because of the appropriation made by subdivision 3 of section 1 of this
21 Act.

22 **SECTION 13. PACE AND AG PACE FUND TRANSFERS.** Notwithstanding any other
23 provision of law, the industrial commission may transfer any unobligated funds between the
24 partnership in assisting community expansion fund and the agriculture partnership in assisting
25 community expansion fund during the period beginning January 1, 2003, and ending June 30,
26 2003.

27 **SECTION 14. EMERGENCY.** The appropriation in subdivision 3 of section 1 and the
28 transfer in section 12 of this Act for the partnership in assisting community expansion fund and
29 the agriculture partnership in assisting community expansion fund are declared to be
30 emergency measures.
