## FIRST ENGROSSMENT with House Amendments ENGROSSED SENATE BILL NO. 2021

(At the request of the Governor)

1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the extension

- 2 service, northern crops institute, upper great plains transportation institute, and the agricultural
- 3 experiment station; to provide statements of legislative intent; to provide for a report to the

4 budget section; and to amend and reenact sections 4-05.1-16, 4-05.1-17, 4-05.1-19, and

5 4-05.1-21 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the membership and duties of the state

6 board of agricultural research and education, the compensation of board members, and the

7 agricultural research fund.

## 8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

9 **SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION.** The funds provided in this section, or so much of the 10 funds as may be necessary, are appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state 11 treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from special funds derived from federal funds and 12 other income to the North Dakota state university extension service, the northern crops 13 institute, the upper great plains transportation institute, and the North Dakota agricultural 14 experiment station for the purpose of defraying the expenses of their various divisions, for the 15 biennium beginning July 1, 2001, and ending June 30, 2003, as follows: 16 Subdivision 1. 17 NORTH DAKOTA STATE UNIVERSITY EXTENSION SERVICE Total all funds 18 \$33,628,046 19 Less estimated income 19,298,301

SECTION 2. ADDITIONAL INCOME - APPROPRIATION. Any additional income
 including funds from federal acts, private grants, gifts and donations, or from other sources
 received by the North Dakota agricultural experiment station, northern crops institute, upper
 great plains transportation institute, and the North Dakota state university extension service,
 except as otherwise provided by law, is appropriated for the purpose designated in the act,
 grant, or donation for the biennium beginning July 1, 2001, and ending June 30, 2003.
 SECTION 3. TRANSFER AUTHORITY. Upon approval of the state board of

agricultural research and education and appropriate research extension center directors, the
director of the North Dakota agricultural experiment station may transfer appropriation authority
within subdivisions 4, 5, and 6 of section 1 of this Act and shall notify the office of management
and budget within ten days following the transfer.

SECTION 4. LEGISLATIVE INTENT - FULL-TIME EQUIVALENTS. The board of
higher education is authorized to adjust or increase full-time equivalent positions as needed,
subject to availability of funds. The board shall report any adjustments to the office of
management and budget prior to the submission of the 2003-05 budget request.

SECTION 5. LEGISLATIVE INTENT - LANGDON LEARNING CENTER. It is the
 intent of the legislative assembly that the Langdon research extension center begin
 construction on the Langdon learning center only when the station has \$500,000 in cash or
 pledges for the learning center for the biennium beginning July 1, 2001, and ending June 30,
 2003.

SECTION 6. LEGISLATIVE INTENT - CARRINGTON RESEARCH CENTER. It is the
 intent of the legislative assembly that the agricultural experiment station develop a modern
 feedmill and feedlot at the Carrington research extension center that will address genetic,
 management, marketing, coproduct, and environmental research needs of beef producers.
 SECTION 7. LEGISLATIVE INTENT - MALT BARLEYS. It is the intent of the
 fifty-seventh legislative assembly that the agricultural experiment station allocate from the main

1 research center \$288,000 of funding for the purpose of developing western North Dakota malt 2 barleys for the biennium beginning July 1, 2001, and ending June 30, 2003. 3 SECTION 8. LEGISLATIVE INTENT - BEEFLINE INITIATIVE. It is the intent of the 4 fifty-seventh legislative assembly that the agricultural experiment station allocate at least 5 \$445,000 of funding for the beefline initiative for the biennium beginning July 1, 2001, and 6 ending June 30, 2003. 7 SECTION 9. LEGISLATIVE INTENT - NEW BARLEY VARIETIES. It is the intent of 8 the fifty-seventh legislative assembly that the agricultural experiment station allocate at least 9 \$228,000 of funding for the purpose of conducting research to develop new feed barley 10 varieties for the biennium beginning July 1, 2001, and ending June 30, 2003. 11 SECTION 10. REPORT TO THE BUDGET SECTION. The state board of agricultural 12 research and education shall present a status report to the budget section of the legislative 13 council during the biennium beginning July 1, 2001, and ending June 30, 2003. The report 14 must include: 15 The number of employees and expenditures for each research extension center 1. 16 and the main station. 17 2. The expenditures from all funds for each state board of agricultural research and 18 education gas tax research initiative. 19 3. A statement for each agricultural experiment station research project indicating the 20 economic impact of each project to the state of North Dakota and how the project 21 relates to the vision statement "North Dakota is to become the trusted provider of 22 the highest quality agricultural products in the world," and a statement regarding 23 North Dakota state university extension service's dissemination of information 24 regarding each agricultural experiment station research project. 25 4. A report on cooperative projects undertaken by the agricultural research center, 26 extension centers, and the main station. 27 5. A report identifying the source of income at the research and extension centers, 28 the use of those funds, and the extent the research projects are affected by each 29 income source. 30 SECTION 11. UNEXPENDED GENERAL FUND - EXCESS INCOME. Any 31 unexpended general fund appropriation authority to and any excess income received by entities

The state board of agricultural research and education shall develop policies
 regarding the award of research grants, including requirements for matching funds,
 cooperation with other in-state and out-of-state researchers, and coordination with
 other in-state and out-of-state proposed or ongoing research projects.

SECTION 16. TRANSFER AUTHORITY. Upon approval from the state board of
agricultural research and education, the director of the North Dakota agricultural experiment
station may transfer appropriation authority within subdivisions 1, 4, and 5 of section 1 of this
Act of up to \$90,000 of estimated income for beef quality assurance and up to \$60,000 of
estimated income for applied research initiatives, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2001, and
ending June 30, 2003.
