## HOUSE BILL NO. 1145

(At the request of the Office of Management and Budget)

1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact sections 15-40.1-07 and 15-40.1-08 of the North

2 Dakota Century Code or in the alternative to amend and reenact sections 15.1-27-06 and

3 15.1-27-07 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the adjustment of weighting factors for

4 per student state aid payments to school districts.

## 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. If House Bill No. 1045 does not become effective, section
15-40.1-07 of the 1999 Supplement to the North Dakota Century Code is amended and
reenacted as follows:

9 **15-40.1-07.** High school per student payments - Amount - Proportionate

payments. Payments must be made each year from state funds to each school district
operating a high school and to each school district contracting to educate high school students
in a federal school, subject to adjustment as provided in section 15-40.1-09, as follows:

- For each high school district having under seventy-five students in average daily
   membership in grades nine through twelve, the amount of money resulting from
   multiplying the factor 1.625 adjusted <u>for the first year of the biennium</u> by
- 16 seventy-five <u>eighty-five</u> percent of the difference between 1.625 and the factor
- 17 representing the five-year average cost of education per student for this category,
- 18 as determined by the superintendent of public instruction, times the number of high
- 19 school students in grades nine through twelve registered in that school district,
- times the educational support per student as provided in section 15-40.1-06. <u>The</u>
  factor is not adjusted for the second year of the biennium.
- For each high school district having seventy-five or more, but less than one
   hundred fifty students in average daily membership in grades nine through twelve,
   the amount of money resulting from multiplying the factor 1.335 adjusted for the

1first year of the biennium by seventy five eighty-five percent of the difference2between 1.335 and the factor representing the five-year average cost of education3per student for this category, as determined by the superintendent of public4instruction, times the number of high school students in grades nine through twelve5registered in that school district, times the educational support per student provided6in section 15-40.1-06. The factor is not adjusted for the second year of the7biennium.

- 8 3. For each high school district having one hundred fifty or more, but less than five 9 hundred fifty students in average daily membership in grades nine through twelve, 10 the amount of money resulting from multiplying the factor 1.24 adjusted for the first 11 year of the biennium by seventy five eighty-five percent of the difference between 12 1.24 and the factor representing the five-year average cost of education per 13 student for this category, as determined by the superintendent of public instruction, 14 times the number of high school students in grades nine through twelve registered 15 in that school district, times the educational support per student provided in section 16 15-40.1-06. The factor is not adjusted for the second year of the biennium.
- 17 4. For each high school district having a total high school enrollment of five hundred 18 fifty or more students in average daily membership in grades nine through twelve, 19 the amount of money resulting from multiplying the factor 1.14 adjusted for the first 20 year of the biennium by seventy five eighty-five percent of the difference between 21 1.14 and the factor representing the five-year average cost of education per 22 student for this category, as determined by the superintendent of public instruction, 23 times the number of high school students in grades nine through twelve registered 24 in that school district, times the educational support per student provided in section 25 15-40.1-06. The factor is not adjusted for the second year of the biennium.
- 5. For high schools having an approved alternative education program, the amount of
  money resulting from multiplying the factor in:
- a. Subsection 1 times the number of students registered in the alternative
  education program, times the educational support per student provided in
  section 15-40.1-06, if the alternative education program has less than
  seventy-five students in average daily membership.

14	Every high school district must receive at least as much in total payments as it would have		
15	received if it had	I the highest number of students in the next lower category. Payments may not	
16	be made unless	four or more units of standard high school work approved by the	
17	superintendent of public instruction are offered during the current year, only licensed teachers		
18	have been employed, and the other standards prescribed by this chapter have been met.		
19	Payments must be made to the high school district in which the student is enrolled for		
20	graduation and units of approved vocational education in accordance with the provisions of		
21	chapter 15-20.1, and other courses approved by the superintendent of public instruction,		
22	earned in another high school district must be included to meet the minimum four required		
23	units. In the cas	e of students enrolled in nonpublic schools for graduation or students enrolled	
24	in less than four	units of standard high school work who are in their fourth year of high school	
25	coursework and who are enrolled in approved alternative high school curriculum programs,		
26	proportionate payments must be made to the public school district in which the student is		
27	enrolled for spec	cific courses.	
28	SECTIO	N 2. AMENDMENT. If House Bill No. 1045 does not become effective, section	
29	15-40.1-08 of th	e 1999 Supplement to the North Dakota Century Code is amended and	

30 reenacted as follows:

- 15-40.1-08. Elementary per student payments Amount. Payments must be made
   from state funds to each school district operating an elementary school and to each school
   district contracting to educate elementary students in a federal school, employing teachers
   holding valid licenses in accordance with section 15-47-46 and chapter 15-36, adjusted as
   provided in section 15-40.1-09, as follows:
- 6 1. For each one-room rural school, the amount of money resulting from multiplying 7 the factor 1.28 adjusted for the first year of the biennium by seventy-five eighty-five 8 percent of the difference between 1.28 and the factor representing the five-year 9 average cost of education per student for this category, as determined by the 10 superintendent of public instruction, times the number of students in that school in 11 grades one through eight in average daily membership, up to a maximum of 12 sixteen students, times the educational support per student provided in section 13 15-40.1-06. The factor is not adjusted for the second year of the biennium. There 14 must be paid .9 times each additional student in its school in grades one through 15 eight in average daily membership times the educational support per student 16 provided in section 15-40.1-06, except that no payment may be made for more 17 than twenty students in average daily membership. If the one-room rural school is 18 located in a school district with another elementary school, the weighting factor for 19 the students in grades one through six must be based on the average daily 20 membership in the district in grades one through six as provided in subsections 2 21 through 4. If the one-room rural school is located in a school district with another 22 school that has students in grade seven or eight, the weighting factor for the 23 students in grade seven or eight must be the same as that provided for in 24 subsection 5.
- 2. For each elementary school in school districts having under one hundred students
  in average daily membership in grades one through six, the amount of money
  resulting from multiplying the factor 1.09 adjusted for the first year of the biennium
  by seventy five eighty-five percent of the difference between 1.09 and the factor
  representing the five-year average cost of education per student for this category,
  as determined by the superintendent of public instruction, times the number of
  students in that school in grades one through six in average daily membership in

1 each classroom or for each teacher, times the educational support per student 2 provided in section 15-40.1-06, except that no payment may be made for more 3 than twenty-five students in average daily membership in each classroom or for 4 each teacher. The factor is not adjusted for the second year of the biennium. 5 For each elementary school in school districts having one hundred or more 3. 6 students in average daily membership in grades one through six, and provided the 7 districts in which such schools are located have an average daily membership of 8 less than one thousand elementary students in grades one through six, the amount 9 of money resulting from multiplying the factor .905 adjusted for the first year of the 10 biennium by seventy five eighty-five percent of the difference between .905 and 11 the factor representing the five-year average cost of education per student for this 12 category, as determined by the superintendent of public instruction, times the 13 number of students in that school in grades one through six in average daily 14 membership in each classroom or for each teacher times the educational support 15 per student provided in section 15-40.1-06, except that no payment may be made 16 for more than thirty students in average daily membership in each classroom or for 17 each teacher. The factor is not adjusted for the second year of the biennium. 18 4. For each elementary school in school districts having an average daily 19 membership of one thousand or more elementary students in grades one through 20 six, the amount of money resulting from multiplying the factor .95 adjusted for the 21 first year of the biennium by seventy-five eighty-five percent of the difference 22 between .95 and the factor representing the five-year average cost of education

- per student for this category, as determined by the superintendent of public
  instruction, times the number of students in that school in grades one through six in
  average daily membership in each classroom or for each teacher times the
  educational support per student provided in section 15-40.1-06, except that no
  payment may be made for more than thirty students in average daily membership
  in each classroom or for each teacher. The factor is not adjusted for the second
  year of the biennium.
- For each of the above classes of elementary schools, except for one-room rural
   schools that are not located in a district with another school having students in

1 grade seven or eight, there must be paid to each school the amount of money 2 resulting from multiplying the factor 1.01 adjusted for the first year of the biennium 3 by seventy-five eighty-five percent of the difference between 1.01 and the factor 4 representing the five-year average cost of education per student for this category, 5 as determined by the superintendent of public instruction, times the number of 6 students in that school in grades seven and eight in average daily membership in 7 each classroom or for each teacher times the educational support per student 8 provided in section 15-40.1-06, except that no payment may be made for more 9 than thirty students in average daily membership in each classroom or for each 10 teacher. The factor is not adjusted for the second year of the biennium.

11 For each elementary school having students under the compulsory age for school 6. 12 attendance, but not less than three years of age, in a special education program 13 approved by the director of special education, the amount of money resulting from 14 multiplying the factor 1.01 adjusted for the first year of the biennium by seventy five eighty-five percent of the difference between 1.01 and the factor representing the 15 16 five-year average cost of education per student for this category, as determined by 17 the superintendent of public instruction, times the number of special education 18 students in that school under the compulsory age for school attendance in average 19 daily membership in each classroom or for each teacher times the educational 20 support per student provided in section 15-40.1-06. The factor is not adjusted for 21 the second year of the biennium.

22 7. For each elementary school providing a kindergarten that is established according 23 to provisions of section 15-45-01, the amount of money resulting from multiplying 24 the factor .50 adjusted for the first year of the biennium by seventy five eighty-five 25 percent of the difference between .50 and the factor representing the five-year 26 average cost of education per student for this category, as determined by the 27 superintendent of public instruction, times the number of students in that school in 28 average daily membership in each classroom or for each teacher times the 29 educational support per student, as provided under section 15-40.1-06, except that 30 no payment may be made for more than twenty-five students in average daily 31 membership in each classroom or for each teacher. The factor is not adjusted for

the second year of the biennium. The full per student payment may be made only
to those kindergarten programs providing the equivalent of ninety full days of
classroom instruction during any twelve-month period. Programs providing shorter
periods of instruction during the same time period must receive a proportionately
smaller per student payment.

6 The superintendent of public instruction shall make proportionate payments to each7 public school district educating students who are also enrolled in nonpublic schools.

8 Every school district must receive at least as much in total payments for elementary 9 students as it would have received if it had the highest number of students in the next lower 10 category.

SECTION 3. AMENDMENT. Section 15.1-27-06 of the North Dakota Century Code as
 created by House Bill No. 1045, as approved by the fifty-seventh legislative assembly, is
 amended and reenacted as follows:

14 15.1-27-06. Per student payments - Weighting factors - High school students.
15 The superintendent of public instruction shall make payments each year, as provided for in this
16 section, to each school district operating a high school and to each school district contracting to
17 educate high school students in a federal school, subject to adjustment as provided in section
18 15.1-27-21.

- 19 1. Each district having under seventy-five students in average daily membership in 20 grades nine through twelve is entitled to receive the amount of money that results 21 from multiplying the factor 1.625 adjusted for the first year of the biennium by 22 seventy five eighty-five percent of the difference between 1.625 and the factor 23 representing the five-year average cost of education per student for this category, 24 as determined by the superintendent of public instruction, by the number of 25 students in grades nine through twelve who are registered in that district, times the 26 per student payment provided for in section 15.1-27-04. The factor is not adjusted 27 for the second year of the biennium.
- Each district having at least seventy-five but fewer than one hundred fifty students
   in average daily membership in grades nine through twelve is entitled to receive
   the amount of money that results from multiplying the factor 1.335 adjusted for the
   first year of the biennium by seventy-five eighty-five percent of the difference

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1 between 1.335 and the factor representing the five-year average cost of education 2 per student for this category, as determined by the superintendent of public 3 instruction, by the number of students in grades nine through twelve who are 4 registered in that district, times the per student payment provided for in section 5 15.1-27-04. The factor is not adjusted for the second year of the biennium. 6 Each district having at least one hundred fifty but fewer than five hundred fifty 3. 7 students in average daily membership in grades nine through twelve is entitled to 8 receive the amount of money that results from multiplying the factor 1.24 adjusted 9 for the first year of the biennium by seventy-five eighty-five percent of the 10 difference between 1.24 and the factor representing the five-year average cost of 11 education per student for this category, as determined by the superintendent of 12 public instruction, by the number of students in grades nine through twelve who are 13 registered in that district, times the per student payment provided for in section 14 15.1-27-04. The factor is not adjusted for the second year of the biennium. 15 4. Each district having at least five hundred fifty students in average daily 16 membership in grades nine through twelve is entitled to receive the amount of 17 money that results from multiplying the factor 1.14 adjusted for the first year of the 18 biennium by seventy-five eighty-five percent of the difference between 1.14 and 19 the factor representing the five-year average cost of education per student for this 20 category, as determined by the superintendent of public instruction, by the number 21 of students in grades nine through twelve who are registered in that district, times 22 the per student payment provided for in section 15.1-27-04. The factor is not 23 adjusted for the second year of the biennium. 24 5. Each district having an approved alternative high school education program is 25 entitled to receive the amount of money that results from multiplying the factor in: 26 Subsection 1 by the number of students registered in the alternative education a. 27 program, times the per student payment provided for in section 15.1-27-04, if 28 fewer than seventy-five students in average daily membership are enrolled in

30 b. Subsection 2 by the number of students registered in the alternative education
 31 program, times the per student payment provided for in section 15.1-27-04, if

the alternative education program.

2		applicable only to the first sixteen students.
3		b. If the one-room rural school has more than sixteen students in average daily

6		provided for in section 15.1-27-04 for each additional student. The district is
7		not entitled to any payment for more than twenty students in average daily

16	2.	Except as provided in subsection 1, each school district having fewer than one
17		hundred students in average daily membership in grades one through six is entitled
18		to receive the amount of money that results from multiplying the factor 1.09
19		adjusted for the first year of the biennium by seventy five eighty-five percent of the
20		difference between 1.09 and the factor representing the five-year average cost of
21		education per student for this category, as determined by the superintendent of
22		public instruction, by the number of students in average daily membership in
23		grades one through six in the district, times the per student payment provided for in
24		section 15.1-27-04. The payment provided for in this subsection is applicable only
25		to the first twenty-five students in average daily membership per classroom or per
26		teacher. The factor is not adjusted for the second year of the biennium.
27	3.	Each school district having at least one hundred students but fewer than one
28		thousand students in average daily membership in grades one through six is
29		entitled to receive the amount of money that results from multiplying the factor .905
30		adjusted for the first year of the biennium by seventy-five eighty-five percent of the
31		difference between .905 and the factor representing the five-year average cost of

education per student for this category, as determined by the superintendent of
 public instruction, by the number of students in average daily membership in
 grades one through six in the district, times the per student payment provided for in
 section 15.1-27-04. <u>The factor is not adjusted for the second year of the biennium.</u>
 The payment provided for in this subsection is applicable only to the first thirty
 students in average daily membership per classroom or per teacher.

7 Each school district having at least one thousand students in average daily 4. 8 membership in grades one through six is entitled to receive the amount of money 9 that results from multiplying the factor .95 adjusted for the first year of the biennium 10 by seventy five eighty-five percent of the difference between .95 and the factor 11 representing the five-year average cost of education per student for this category, 12 as determined by the superintendent of public instruction, by the number of 13 students in average daily membership in grades one through six in the district, 14 times the per student payment provided for in section 15.1-27-04. The factor is not 15 adjusted for the second year of the biennium. The payment provided for in this 16 subsection is applicable only to the first thirty students in average daily 17 membership per classroom or per teacher.

18 Each school district having students in grades seven and eight is entitled to receive 5. 19 the amount of money that results from multiplying the factor 1.01 adjusted for the 20 first year of the biennium by seventy-five eighty-five percent of the difference 21 between 1.01 and the factor representing the five-year average cost of education 22 per student for this category, as determined by the superintendent of public 23 instruction, by the number of students in average daily membership in grades 24 seven and eight in the district, times the per student payment provided for in 25 section 15.1-27-04. The factor is not adjusted for the second year of the biennium. 26 The payment provided for in this subsection is applicable only to the first thirty 27 students in average daily membership per classroom or per teacher. The 28 payments provided for in this subsection are not available for students who attend 29 a one-room rural school if that school is the only one in the district that offers 30 educational services to students in grades seven and eight.

1 6. Each school district having a special education program approved by the director 2 of special education is entitled to receive, for each student who is enrolled in the 3 program and who is at least three years of age but less than the compulsory age 4 for school attendance, the amount of money that results from multiplying the factor 5 1.01 adjusted for the first year of the biennium by seventy five eighty-five percent 6 of the difference between 1.01 and the factor representing the five-year average 7 cost of education per student for this category, as determined by the 8 superintendent of public instruction, by the number of special education students in 9 average daily membership in the program who are at least three years of age but 10 less than the compulsory age for school attendance, times the per student 11 payment provided for in section 15.1-27-04. The factor is not adjusted for the 12 second year of the biennium.

13 7. Each school district operating a kindergarten as provided for in section a. 14 15.1-22-02 is entitled to receive the amount of money that results from 15 multiplying the factor .50 adjusted for the first year of the biennium by 16 eighty-five percent of the difference between .50 and the factor representing 17 the five-year average cost of education per student for this category, as 18 determined by the superintendent of public instruction, by the number of 19 kindergarten students in average daily membership in the district, times the 20 per student payment provided for in section 15.1-27-04. The factor is not 21 adjusted for the second year of the biennium. The payment provided for in 22 this subsection is applicable only to the first twenty-five students in average 23 daily membership per classroom or per teacher.

b. In order to receive the full per student payment available under this section, a
district must operate a kindergarten program that provides the equivalent of
ninety full days of classroom instruction during a twelve-month period. A
district is entitled to a prorated payment under this section if it operates a
kindergarten program of shorter duration.

Each school district that educates students who are also enrolled in nonpublic
 schools is entitled to receive proportionate payments under this section.

1 9. Each school district is entitled to receive as much in total payments for elementary 2 students as it would have received if it had the highest number of students in the 3 next lower category. 4 10. A school district is not entitled to any payments provided for by this chapter unless 5 each teacher employed by the district: 6 Holds a teaching license issued by the education standards and practices a. 7 board; or 8 Has been approved to teach by the education standards and practices board. b.
