## Introduced by

- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact sections 4-35-05, 4-35-06, 4-35-08, 4-35-09, 4-35-13,
- 2 4-35-15, 4-35-19, and subsection 4 of section 4-35.1-01 of the North Dakota Century Code,
- 3 relating to pesticide applicators.

## 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

5 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 4-35-05 of the 1999 Supplement to the North
6 Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

- 7 **4-35-05. Definitions.** As used in this chapter:
- 8 1. "Animal" means all vertebrate and invertebrate species, including, but not limited
   9 to, man humans and other mammals, birds, fish, and shellfish.
- "Antidote" means a practical treatment in case of poisoning and includes first aid
   treatment.
- 12 <del>2.1.</del> <u>3.</u> "Applicator" means any person who applies a pesticide to land.
- 3. <u>4.</u> "Beneficial insects" means those insects which <u>that</u>, during their life cycle, are
   effective pollinators of plants, are parasites, or predators of pests.
- 4. a. <u>5.</u> "Certified applicator" means any individual who is certified under this chapter as
   authorized to use any restricted use pesticide covered by the applicator's
   certification. The term includes a commercial applicator and a private applicator.
- 18b."Private applicator" means a certified applicator who uses or supervises the19use of any pesticide which is classified for restricted use for purposes of20producing any agricultural commodity on property owned or rented by the21applicator or the applicator's employer or, if applied without compensation22other than trading of personal services between producers of agricultural23commodities, on the property of another person.

2		is a private applicator with respect to some uses, who uses any pesticide which is
3		elassified for restricted use, for any purpose or on any property, other than as
4		provided for by subdivision b a private applicator.
5	<del>5.</del> <u>7.</u>	"Dealer" means any person who sells a pesticide to an end user.
6	<del>6.</del> <u>8.</u>	"Defoliant" means any substance or mixture of substances intended to cause the
7		leaves or foliage to drop from a plant, with or without causing abscission.
8	<del>7.</del> <u>9.</u>	"Desiccant" means any substance or mixture of substances intended to artificially
9		accelerate the drying of plant tissue.
10	<del>8.</del> <u>10.</u>	"Device" means any instrument or contrivance, other than a firearm, which is
11		intended for trapping, destroying, repelling, or mitigating any pest or any other form
12		of plant or animal life, other than man human and other than bacteria, virus, or
13		other micro-organism on or in living man humans or other living animals, but not
14		including equipment used for the application of pesticides when sold separately
15		therefrom.

17		in this state.
18	<del>10.</del> <u>12.</u>	"Environment" includes water, air, land, and all plants and man humans and other
19		animals living therein, and the interrelationships which exist among these.
20	<del>11.</del> <u>13.</u>	"Equipment" means any type of ground, water, or aerial equipment or contrivance
21		using motorized, mechanical, or pressurized power and used to apply any
22		pesticide on land and anything that may be growing, habitating, or stored on or in
23		such land, but shall. The term does not include any pressurized hand-sized
24		household apparatus used to apply any pesticide, or any equipment or contrivance
25		of which the person who is applying the pesticide is the source of power or energy
26		in making such pesticide application.

28		non-chlorophyll-bearing plant of a lower order than mosses and liverworts as, for

30		man humans or other living animals, and except those on or in processed food,
31		beverages, or pharmaceuticals.

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113.15."Insect" means any of the numerous small invertebrate animals generally having2the body more or less obviously segmented, for the most part belonging to the3class of insecta, comprising six-legged, usually winged forms, and to other allied4classes of arthropods whose members are wingless and usually have more than5six legs.

- 6 <u>14.</u> <u>16.</u> "Label" means the written, printed, or graphic matter on, or attached to, the
  7 pesticide or device or any of its containers or wrappers.
- 8 15. <u>17.</u> "Labeling" means the label and all other written, printed, or graphic matter:
  - a. Accompanying the pesticide or device; and
- 10 b. To which reference is made on the label or in literature accompanying or 11 referring to the pesticide, except when accurate nonmisleading references are 12 made to current official publications of the board; the United States 13 environmental protection agency; the United States departments of 14 agriculture and interior; the United States department of health and human 15 services; state agricultural colleges; and other similar federal or state 16 institutions or agencies authorized by law to conduct research in the field of 17 pesticides.
- 18 <u>16.</u> <u>18.</u> "Land" means all land and water areas, including airspace, and all plants, animals,
   19 structures, buildings, contrivances, and machinery, appurtenant thereto or situated
   20 thereon, fixed or mobile, including any used for transportation.
- 21 <del>17.</del> <u>19.</u> "Mixture" means a diluted pesticide combination.
- 18. 20. "Nematode" means invertebrate animals of the phylum nemathelminthes, and
  class nematoda, i.e., unsegmented round worms with elongated, fusiform, or
  saclike bodies covered with cuticle, and inhabiting soil, water, plants, or plant
  parts, may also be called nemas or eelworms.
- 26 <u>49.</u> <u>21.</u> "Person" means any individual, partnership, association, fiduciary, corporation,
  27 limited liability company, or any organized group of persons, whether or not
  28 incorporated.

- 30 a. Any insect, snail, slug, rodent, nematode, fungus, weed; or

21			person.

1		b. In issuing such regulations adopting rules, the board shall give consideration
2		to pertinent research findings and recommendations of other agencies of this
3		state, the federal government, or other reliable sources.
4	2.	For the purpose of uniformity, the board may adopt, pursuant to chapter 28-32,
5		restricted use classifications as determined by the federal environmental protection
6		agency. The board may also by regulation rule determine state restricted use
7		pesticides for the state or designated areas within the state.
8	3.	The board, in adopting rules under this chapter, shall prescribe standards and
9		requirements for the certification of applicators of restricted use pesticides. These
10		standards and requirements must relate to the use and handling of pesticides. In
11		determining these standards and requirements, the board shall take into
12		consideration standards and requirements prescribed by the environmental
13		protection agency.
14	4.	Regulations Rules adopted under this chapter may not permit any pesticide use
15		which is prohibited by the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide, and Rodenticide Act or
16		regulations or orders issued thereunder.
17	5.	In order to comply with section 4 of the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide, and
18		Rodenticide Act, the board is authorized to may make such reports to the United
19		States environmental protection agency in such form and containing such
20		information as that agency may from time to time require.
21	6.	The board is authorized to make appropriate regulations, in accordance with
22		chapter 28-32, for carrying out the provisions of this chapter, including, but not
23		limited to, regulations providing Rules to implement this chapter may provide for:
24		a. The collection, examination, and reporting of samples of pesticides.
25		b. The safe handling, transportation, storage, display, distribution, and disposal
26		of pesticides and their containers.
27	<del>7.</del>	c. The board may by regulation identify "pests" under the guidelines of the
28		definition of the term "pest" contained within The identification of pests under
29		this chapter when it the board finds particular organisms to be annoying or
30		otherwise injurious or harmful to agriculture, health, and the environment.

SECTION 3. AMENDMENT. Section 4-35-08 of the 1999 Supplement to the North
 Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

3 4-35-08. Classification of certificates. The board may classify commercial 4 certificates to be issued under this chapter. Such The classifications may include pest control 5 operators, wood treaters, ornamental or agricultural pesticide applicators, or right-of-way 6 pesticide applicators. Separate classifications may be specified as to ground, aerial, or manual 7 methods used by any applicator to apply restricted use pesticides or to the use of restricted use 8 pesticides to control insects and plant diseases, rodents, or weeds. Each classification of 9 certification may be subject to separate testing procedures and training requirements; provided 10 that a person may be required to pay an additional fee if such the person desires to be certified 11 in one or more of the classifications provided for by the board under the authority of this 12 section. 13 SECTION 4. AMENDMENT. Section 4-35-09 of the 1999 Supplement to the North 14 Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows: 15 4-35-09. Commercial applicator's certification. 16 No person who would be a A commercial applicator if certified may not purchase 1. 17 or use a restricted use pesticide without first complying with the certification 18 standards and requirements of this chapter, or other restrictions as may be 19 determined by the board. 20 2. An individual may be certified as a commercial applicator within a classification if 21 the individual successfully completes an examination for the classification as 22 prescribed by the board and administered by the North Dakota state university 23 extension service or the service's designee. An application for certification must 24 be on a form prescribed by the board and accompanied by a reasonable 25 examination fee set by the board. 26 3. If the North Dakota state university extension service, or its designee, finds the 27 applicant qualified to apply pesticides in the classifications he for which the 28 applicant has applied for, after examination as the board requires, and the 29 applicant meets all other requirements of this chapter, the North Dakota state 30 university extension service shall issue a commercial applicator's certificate limited 31 to the classifications in which the applicant is qualified in.

1	4.	If certification is not to be issued as applied for, the North Dakota state university		
2		extension service, or its designee, shall inform the applicant in writing of the		
3		reasons for not issuing the certification. Individuals certified pursuant to this		
4		section are deemed certified commercial applicators for the use of restricted use		
5		pesticides.

25		labeling or other restrictions prescribed by the board.		
26	3.	Applied materials known by that person to be ineffective or improper.		
27	4.	Operated faulty or unsafe equipment.		
28	5.	Operated in a faulty, careless, or negligent manner.		
29	6.	Neglected, or, after notice, refused to comply with the provisions of this chapter,		
30		the rules adopted hereunder to implement this chapter, or of any lawful order of		
31		the commissioner.		

1	7.	Refused or neglected to keep and maintain the records required by this chapter, or
2		to make reports when and as required.
3	8.	Made false or fraudulent records, invoices, or reports.
4	9.	Operated unlicensed equipment in violation of section 4-35-17.
5	10.	Used fraud or misrepresentation in making an application for, or for renewal of,
6		certification.
7	11.	Refused or neglected to comply with any limitations or restrictions on or in a duly
8		issued certification.

24	SE	CTION 7. AMENDMENT. Section 4-35-19 of the 1999 Supplement to the North
25	Dakota Cer	ntury Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
26	4-3	5-19. Exemptions.
27	1.	The certification requirements of this chapter do not apply to any a competent
28		person applying general use pesticides that are not classified for restricted use
29		under the direct supervision of a commercial applicator, unless the pesticide label
30		requires that a certified applicator personally apply the pesticide. A pesticide is
31		deemed to be applied under the direct supervision of a commercial applicator if the

1		pesticide is applied by a competent person acting under the instruction and control
2		of a certified applicator who is physically available if needed. The certified
3		applicator need not be present when the pesticide is applied. Direct supervision
4		with respect to applications using aircraft requires that the pilot of the aircraft be
5		appropriately certified.
6	<del>2.</del>	The provisions certification requirements of this chapter relating to certification
7		requirements do not apply to a competent person applying restricted use
8		pesticides under the direct supervision of a private applicator, unless the pesticide
9		labeling label requires that a certified applicator personally applies apply the
10		nerticular resticida. A resticida is servidenced deserved to be emplied under the

- 10particular pesticide. A pesticide is considered deemed to be applied under the11direct supervision of a private applicator if it is applied by a competent person12acting under the instructions instruction and control of a private applicator who is13available if and when needed, even though such the private applicator is not14physically present at the time and place that the pesticide is applied.
- 3. 2. Persons The certification requirements of this chapter do not apply to any person
   conducting laboratory-type research using restricted use pesticides and doctors or
   to a doctor of medicine and doctors or a doctor of veterinary medicine applying
   pesticides as drugs a pesticide as a drug or as medication during the course of
   their normal practice.
- 20SECTION 8. AMENDMENT. Subsection 4 of section 4-35.1-01 of the 199921Supplement to the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
- 4. "Pesticide" means that term as defined by subsection 21 of in section 4-35-05.
