- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact sections 43-12.1-02, 43-12.1-03, 43-12.1-04,
- 2 43-12.1-07, 43-12.1-08, 43-12.1-09, 43-12.1-10, 43-12.1-11, 43-12.1-13, 43-12.1-14, and
- 3 43-12.1-15 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to specialty nursing practice, unlicensed
- 4 assistive personnel, persons exempt from licensure, residency requirements for nursing
- 5 practice, compensation of board members, and disciplinary procedures.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 43-12.1-02 of the 1999 Supplement to the North
 Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
- 9 **43-12.1-02. Definitions.** In this chapter, unless the context or subject matter otherwise 10 requires:
 - "Advanced practice registered nurse" means a person who holds a current license
 to practice in this state as an advanced practice registered nurse and either has a
 graduate degree with a nursing focus or has completed the educational
 requirements in effect when the person was initially licensed.
 - 2. "Board" means the North Dakota board of nursing.
 - 3. "Licensed practical nurse" means a person who holds a current license to practice in this state as a licensed practical nurse and either has an associate degree with a major in nursing or has completed the educational requirements in effect when the person was initially licensed.
 - "Nurse" means any person currently licensed as an advanced practice registered nurse, registered nurse, or licensed practical nurse.
- 22 5. "Nurse assistant" means a person who is authorized by the board to perform
 23 nursing tasks delegated and supervised by a licensed nurse.

1 "Nursing" means the performance of acts utilizing specialized knowledge, skills, 2 and abilities for people in a variety of settings. Nursing includes the following acts, 3 which may not be deemed to include acts of medical diagnosis or treatment or the 4 practice of medicine as defined in chapter 43-17: 5 The maintenance of health and prevention of illness. a. 6 b. Diagnosing human responses to actual or potential health problems. 7 Providing supportive and restorative care and nursing treatment, medication C. 8 administration, health counseling and teaching, case finding and referral of 9 persons who are ill, injured, or experiencing changes in the normal health 10 processes. 11 d. Administration, teaching, supervision, delegation, and evaluation of health and 12 nursing practices. 13 Collaboration with other health care professionals in the implementation of the e. 14 total health care regimen and execution of the health care regimen prescribed 15 by a health care practitioner licensed under title 43. 7. <u>6.</u> 16 "Prescriptive practices" means assessing the need for drugs, immunizing agents, 17 or devices and writing a prescription to be filled by a licensed pharmacist. 18 "Registered nurse" means a person who holds a current license to practice in this 8. 7. 19 state as a registered nurse and either has a baccalaureate degree with a major in 20 nursing or has completed the educational requirements in effect when the person 21 was initially licensed. 22 "Specialty practice registered nurse" means a person who holds a current license 8. 23 to practice in this state as a specialty practice registered nurse and has the 24 educational preparation and national certification within a defined area of nursing 25 practice. 26 "Unlicensed assistive person" means an assistant to the nurse who regardless of 9. 27 title is authorized by the board to perform nursing interventions delegated and 28 supervised by a licensed nurse. 29 SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 43-12.1-03 of the 1999 Supplement to the North 30 Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

Establish a nursing student loan program funded by license fees to encourage 26 persons to enter and advance in the nursing profession. 27 15. Establish a registry of persons licensed or registered by the board.

Adopt rules to allow nurses licensed by another state to receive short-term clinical 8 education in North Dakota health care facilities. 9 SECTION 6. AMENDMENT. Section 43-12.1-09 of the 1999 Supplement to the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows: 10 11 43-12.1-09. Licensure - Registration. Each applicant who successfully meets the 12 requirements of this section is entitled to initial licensure or registration as follows: 13 An applicant for licensure by examination to practice as a registered nurse or 14 licensed practical nurse shall: Submit a completed application and appropriate fee as established by the 15 a. 16 board: 17 Submit an official transcript showing completion of a board-approved nursing b. 18 education program preparing for the level of licensure sought; and 19 Pass an examination approved by the board. C. 20 2. An applicant for licensure by endorsement to practice as a registered nurse or 21 licensed practical nurse shall: 22 Submit a completed application and appropriate fee as established by the a. 23 board; 24 b. Submit an official transcript showing completion of a nursing education 25 program equal to or exceeding the requirements for nursing education 26 programs in place in this state at the time the applicant qualified for initial 27 licensure; 28 Submit proof of initial licensure by examination with the examination meeting C. 29 the state requirements for licensure examinations in effect at the time the 30 applicant qualified for initial licensure; and

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Submit evidence of current unencumbered licensure in another state or 1 d. 2 territory or meet continued competency requirements as established by the 3 board. 4 3. If an applicant for licensure by endorsement does not meet the educational 5 requirements for the appropriate level of licensure as established by the board, a 6 transitional license may be issued. A transitional license may be issued and 7 renewed according to board rules. Renewal requires proof of progression towards 8 meeting the educational requirements. 9 An applicant for licensure as an advanced practice registered nurse shall: 10 Submit a completed application and appropriate fee as established by the 11 board: 12 b. Submit evidence of appropriate education and current certification in an 13 advanced nursing role by a national nursing organization meeting criteria as 14 established by the board; and Possess or show evidence of application for a current unencumbered 15 C. 16 registered nurse license. 17 5. An applicant for licensure as an advanced practice registered nurse who 18 completed an advanced nursing education program and was licensed or certified in 19 advanced practice by another state before January 1, 2001, or who completed an 20 advanced nursing education program and was licensed or certified as a women's 21 health care nurse practitioner by another state before January 1, 2007, may apply 22 for and receive an advanced practice license if that person meets the requirements 23 that were in place in this state at the time the applicant qualified for initial advanced 24 practice licensure in that state. 25 6. An applicant for nurse assistant unlicensed assistive person registration shall: 26 Submit a completed application and the appropriate fee as established by the 27 board; and 28 Provide verification of appropriate training and, evidence of certification or b. 29 evaluation in the performance of basic nursing tasks interventions.

An applicant for licensure as a specialty practice registered nurse shall:

1 Submit a completed application and appropriate fees as established by the a. 2 board; 3 Submit evidence of appropriate education and current certification in a b. 4 specialty nursing role by a national nursing organization meeting criteria as 5 established by the board; and 6 Possess or show evidence of application for a current unencumbered C. 7 registered nurse license. 8 SECTION 7. AMENDMENT. Section 43-12.1-10 of the 1999 Supplement to the North 9 Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows: 10 43-12.1-10. License - Registration - Renewal. 11 A current license to practice as an advanced practice registered nurse, registered 12 nurse, or licensed practical nurse must be issued upon proof that the applicant 13 meets all requirements for licensure and is a resident of North Dakota or upon 14 verification of employment in North Dakota or by a federal agency. If a person 15 does not renew a license before its expiration date, the license may be reinstated if 16 that person meets the requirements set by the board. 17 2. A nurse assistant An unlicensed assistive person may renew registration upon 18 submission of a renewal application, appropriate fee established by the board and 19 documentation of competency by the employer or evidence of certification. A 20 lapsed nurse assistant unlicensed assistive person registration may be renewed upon submission of the application, payment of the appropriate fee established by 21 22 the board, and documentation of competency or evidence of certification. 23 **SECTION 8. AMENDMENT.** Section 43-12.1-11 of the 1999 Supplement to the North 24 Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows: 25 **43-12.1-11.** Duties of licensees and registrants. Each person licensed or registered 26 by the board shall provide information requested by the board at the time of renewal. Each 27 person licensed or registered by the board shall report to the board any knowledge of the 28 performance by others of those acts or omissions that are violations of this chapter or grounds 29 for disciplinary action as set forth in section 43-12.1-14. Each licensed nurse licensee or 30 registrant shall report to the board any judgment or settlement in a professional or occupational

malpractice action to which the licensee or registrant is a party. Any person, other than a

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- 1 licensee or registrant alleged to have violated this chapter, participating in good faith in making
- 2 a report, assisting in an investigation, or furnishing information to an investigator, is immune
- 3 from any civil or criminal liability that otherwise may result from reporting required by this
- 4 section. For the purpose of any civil or criminal proceeding the good faith of any person
- 5 required to report under this section is presumed.
 - **SECTION 9. AMENDMENT.** Section 43-12.1-13 of the 1999 Supplement to the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
- 8 **43-12.1-13. Disciplinary proceedings.** Disciplinary proceedings under this chapter 9 must be conducted in accordance with chapter 28-32. Fees of up to one thousand dollars for 10 each separate violation or the assessment of costs and disbursements, or both, may be 11 imposed against a respondent in addition to any licensure or registration sanctions the board 12 may impose. An appeal from the final decision of the board may be taken to the district court of 13 Burleigh County under chapter 28-32. The board shall furnish to the boards of nursing of other 14 states by means including the data bank of the national council of state boards of nursing, to 15 data banks as required by federal law and to health care agencies of this state, a list of the 16 names and addresses of licensees or registrants who have been disciplined by the board.
 - **SECTION 10. AMENDMENT.** Section 43-12.1-14 of the 1999 Supplement to the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
 - 43-12.1-14. Grounds for discipline Penalties. The board may suspend, revoke, place on probation, refuse to issue or renew a license, or reprimand a licensee or registrant if the licensee or registrant deny, limit, revoke, probate, encumber, or suspend any license or registration to practice nursing issued by the board or applied for in accordance with this chapter; reprimand or otherwise discipline a licensee, registrant, or applicant; deny admission to licensure or registration examination; provide an alternative to discipline in situations involving impairments of chemical dependency or psychiatric or physical disorders; or require evidence of evaluation and treatment, upon proof that the person:
 - Has been arrested, charged, or convicted by a court, or has entered a plea of nolo contendere to a crime in any jurisdiction that relates adversely to the practice of nursing and the licensee or registrant has not demonstrated sufficient rehabilitation under section 12.1-33-02.1;

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- 1 2. Has been disciplined by a board of nursing in another jurisdiction, or has had a 2 license or registration to practice nursing or to assist in the practice of nursing or to 3 practice in another health care occupation or profession denied, revoked, 4 suspended, or otherwise restricted sanctioned; 5 3.
 - Has engaged in any practice inconsistent with the standards of nursing practice;
 - 4. Has obtained or attempted to obtain by fraud or deceit a license or registration to practice nursing, or has submitted to the board any information that is fraudulent, deceitful, or false;
 - 5. Is unfit or incompetent to practice nursing by reason of negligence, patterns of behavior, or other causes as established under rules adopted by the board Has engaged in a pattern of practice or other behavior that demonstrates professional misconduct;
 - Has diverted or attempted to divert supplies, equipment, drugs or controlled 6. substances for personal use or unauthorized use;
 - 7. Has practiced nursing in this state without a current license or as otherwise prohibited by this chapter:
 - 8. Has failed to report any violation of this chapter or rules adopted under this chapter; or
 - 9. Has failed to meet the duties of a licensee or registrant under this chapter observe and follow the duly adopted standards, policies, directives, and orders of the board, or has violated any other provision of this chapter.
 - **SECTION 11. AMENDMENT.** Section 43-12.1-15 of the 1999 Supplement to the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

43-12.1-15. Violation - Penalties. A person may not:

- Buy or sell, fraudulently obtain, or furnish any questions and answers used in the licensing examination for nurses, or assist others in the performance of these acts.
- 2. Buy or sell, fraudulently obtain, or furnish any record which might enable a person to obtain a license in this state or assist others in the performance of these acts.
- 3. Practice as an advanced practice registered nurse, a registered nurse, or a licensed practical nurse through use of a transcript from a school of nursing,

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- diploma, certificate of registration, license, or record which was fraudulently created or obtained.
- 4. Practice as an advanced practice registered nurse, a registered nurse, or a licensed practical nurse as defined by this chapter unless licensed to do so.
 - 5. Conduct any education program preparing a person for nursing licensure or registration unless the program has been approved or accepted by the board.
 - 6. Employ a person to practice nursing or perform nursing tasks interventions unless the person is licensed or registered by the board.
- 9 Any violation of this chapter is a class B misdemeanor.
