- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 39-06.2-01, subdivision b of subsection 2 of
- 2 section 39-06.2-09, and section 39-06.2-10 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to
- 3 driving a commercial motor vehicle; and to provide a penalty.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

5 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 39-06.2-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is 6 amended and reenacted as follows:

39-06.2-01. Uniform Commercial Driver's License Act. The purpose of this chapter
is to implement the federal Commercial Motor Vehicle Safety Act of 1986 [Title XII of

9 Pub. L. 99-570, 49 U.S.C. 2701, repealed] and Motor Carrier Safety Improvement Act of 1999

10 [Pub. L. 106-159; 113 Stat. 1748; 49 U.S.C. 113 et seq.] and reduce or prevent commercial

11 motor vehicle accidents, fatalities, and injuries by:

- 12 1. Permitting commercial drivers to hold only one license;
- Disqualifying commercial drivers who have committed certain serious traffic
 violations, or other specified offenses; and

15 3. Strengthening commercial driver's licensing and testing standards.

16 This chapter is a remedial law which should be liberally construed to promote the public health,

- 17 safety, and welfare. To the extent that this chapter conflicts with general driver's licensing
- 18 provisions, this chapter prevails. Where this chapter is silent, the general driver's licensing
- 19 provisions apply.
- SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Subdivision b of subsection 2 of section 39-06.2-09 of the
 North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
- 22 b. Endorsements and restrictions.
- 23 (1) "H" authorizes the driver to drive a vehicle transporting hazardous
 24 materials.

10	5.	A person is disqualified from driving a commercial motor vehicle for a period of not		
11		less	than s	sixty days if convicted of two serious traffic violations, or one hundred
12		twer	nty day	s if convicted of three serious traffic violations, committed in a
13		com	mercia	al motor vehicle arising from separate incidents occurring within a
14		three-year period.		
15	6.	Disqualification for railroad-highway grade crossing violation:		
16		<u>a.</u>	<u>A driv</u>	ver who is convicted of driving a commercial motor vehicle in violation of
17			<u>a fed</u>	eral, state, or local law or regulation pertaining to any one of the following
18			<u>six of</u>	fenses at a railroad-highway grade crossing is disqualified for the period
19		of time specified in subdivision b:		
20			<u>(1)</u>	For drivers who are not required to always stop, failing to slow down
21				and check that the tracks are clear of an approaching train;
22			<u>(2)</u>	For drivers who are not required to always stop, failing to stop before
23				reaching the crossing, if the tracks are not clear;
24			<u>(3)</u>	For drivers who are always required to stop, failing to stop before
25				driving onto the crossing;
26			<u>(4)</u>	For all drivers, to have sufficient space to drive completely through the
27				crossing without stopping;
28			<u>(5)</u>	For all drivers, failing to obey a traffic control device or the directions of
29				an enforcement official at the crossing; and
30			<u>(6)</u>	For all drivers, failing to negotiate a crossing because of insufficient
31				undercarriage clearance.

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1		<u>b.</u> Dui	ation of disqualification for a railroad-highway grade crossing violation:
2		<u>(1)</u>	First violation. A driver is disqualified for not less than sixty days if the
3			driver is convicted of a first violation of a railroad-highway grade
4			crossing violation.
5		<u>(2)</u>	Second violation. A driver is disqualified for not less than one hundred
6			twenty days if, during any three-year period, the driver is convicted of a
7			second railroad-highway grade crossing violation in separate incidents.
8		<u>(3)</u>	Third or subsequent violation. A driver is disqualified for not less than
9			one year if, during any three-year period, the driver is convicted of a
10			third or subsequent railroad-highway grade crossing violation in
11			separate incidents.
12	<u>7.</u>	Notice a	nd hearing. Prior to suspending, revoking, or disqualifying a driver under
13		this sect	ion, the director must provide the driver with notice of opportunity for
14		hearing,	in accordance with section 39-06-33, and the hearing requested must be
15		held in a	ccordance with section 39-06-33.
16	7. <u>8.</u>	After sus	spending, revoking, or canceling a commercial driver's license, the director
17		shall upo	date the director's records to reflect that action within ten days. After
18		suspend	ing, revoking, or canceling a nonresident commercial driver's privileges,
19		the direc	tor shall notify the licensing authority of the state that issued the
20		commer	cial driver's license or commercial driver's instruction permit within ten
21		days.
