1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 25-17 and a new subsection to

2 section 50-10-06 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to definitions for the newborn

3 screening law and services for treatment of phenylketonuria and maple syrup urine disease;

4 and to amend and reenact sections 25-17-01, 25-17-02, 25-17-03, 25-17-04, 25-17-05, and

5 26.1-36-09.7 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to services and insurance coverage

6 for treatment of metabolic diseases.

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

8	SECTION 1. A new section to chapter 25-17 of the North Dakota Century Code is				
9	created and enacted as follows:				
10	Definitions. As used in this chapter, unless the context otherwise requires:				
11	<u>1.</u>	"Low-protein modified food product" means a food product that is specially			
12		formulated to have less than one gram of protein per serving and is intended to be			
13		used under the direction of a physician for the dietary treatment of a metabolic			
14		disease. The term does not include a natural food that is naturally low in protein.			
15	<u>2.</u>	"Medical food" means a food that is intended for the dietary treatment of a disease			
16		or condition for which nutritional requirements are established by medical			
17		evaluation and is formulated to be consumed or administered under the direction			
18		of a physician.			
19	<u>3.</u>	"Metabolic disease" means a disease as designated by rule of the state health			
20		council for which early identification and timely intervention will lead to a significant			
21		reduction in mortality, morbidity, and associated disabilities.			
22	2 SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 25-17-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is				
23	23 amended and reenacted as follows:				

1 25-17-01. Phenylketonuria and galactosemia Newborn screening education 2 programs and tests. The state department of health shall: 3 1. Develop and carry out an intensive implement a metabolic disease educational 4 program among physicians, hospital staffs of hospitals, public health nurses, and 5 the citizens of this state concerning the diseases phenylketonuria and 6 galactosemia, and other metabolic diseases causing mental retardation for which 7 appropriate methods of detection, prevention, or treatment are available. This 8 educational program must include information about the nature of the diseases 9 and examinations about screening for the early detection of such these diseases 10 in order so that proper measures may be taken to prevent mental retardation 11 reduce mortality, morbidity, and associated disabilities. 12 2. Provide, on a statewide basis, <u>a newborn</u> screening, diagnostic, system and 13 treatment control tests short-term followup services for which approved laboratory 14 procedures are available for phenylketonuria, galactosemia, and other metabolic 15 diseases causing mental retardation. 16 3. Provide that, upon completion of the testing, the actual testing materials must be 17 returned to the department. The department shall forward the actual testing 18 materials to the university of North Dakota school of medicine for storage and 19 research purposes. The materials in the possession of the university of North 20 Dakota school of medicine may not be destroyed without the authorization of the 21 department. Coordinate with or refer individuals to public and private health care 22 service providers for long-term followup services for metabolic diseases. 23 SECTION 3. AMENDMENT. Section 25-17-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is 24 amended and reenacted as follows: 25 25-17-02. Establishment of testing regulations Rulemaking requirement. The 26 state department of health council and the department of human services shall establish 27 standards and methods of testing to be employed for the determination of the diseases referred 28 to in section 25-17-01 for which statewide testing programs are established adopt rules 29 necessary to implement this chapter. 30 SECTION 4. AMENDMENT. Section 25-17-03 of the North Dakota Century Code is 31 amended and reenacted as follows:

4			phenylketonuria, galactosemia, and other metabolic diseases with the

6	2.	<u>b.</u>	Make arrangements Refer every diagnosed case of a metabolic disease to a
7			qualified health care provider for the necessary treatment for diagnosed
8			cases where treatment is indicated and the family is unable to pay the cost of
9			such treatment of the metabolic disease.
10		<u>C.</u>	Maintain a registry of cases of phenylketonuria, galactosemia, and other
11			metabolic diseases for the purpose of followup services to prevent mental
12			retardation.
13	<u>2.</u>	The	e department of human services, as a program provided under chapter 50-10,
14		<u>sha</u>	<u>II:</u>
15		<u>a.</u>	Provide medical food at no cost to males under age twenty-two and females
16			under age forty-five who are diagnosed with phenylketonuria or maple syrup
17			urine disease, regardless of income. If treatment services under this
18			subsection are provided to an individual by the department, the department
19			may seek reimbursement from any government program that provides
20			coverage to that individual for the treatment services provided by the
21			department.
22		<u>b.</u>	Offer for sale at cost medical food to females age forty-five and over and to
23			males age twenty-two and over who are diagnosed with phenylketonuria or
24			maple syrup urine disease, regardless of income. These individuals are
25			responsible for payment to the department for the cost of medical food.
26		<u>C.</u>	Provide low-protein modified food products, if medically necessary as
27			determined by a qualified health care provider, to females under age forty-five
28			and males under age twenty-two who are receiving medical assistance and
29			are diagnosed with phenylketonuria or maple syrup urine disease.
30	SE	CTIO	N 5. AMENDMENT. Section 25-17-04 of the North Dakota Century Code is
31	amended a	and re	enacted as follows:

1	25-17-04	I. Physician to initiate test and report positive diagnosis Testing and
2	reporting requi	rements. The physician attending a newborn child, or the birth attendant in the
3	case of an out-o	f-hospital birth, shall cause that newborn child to be subjected to testing for
4	phenylketonuria	, galactosemia, and other metabolic diseases, in the manner prescribed by the
5	state departmen	t of health. A physician attending a case of phenylketonuria, galactosemia, or
6	other patient wit	h a metabolic disease which may cause mental retardation shall report the
7	case to the state	e department of health. This The testing requirements of this section does do
8	not apply if the p	parents of a <u>newborn</u> child object thereto to the testing on the grounds that
9	testing for metal	polic diseases conflicts with their religious tenets and practices.
10	SECTIO	N 6. AMENDMENT. Section 25-17-05 of the North Dakota Century Code is
11	amended and re	enacted as follows:
12	25-17-05	5. Testing charges. The state department of health shall council may adopt
13	rules that establ	ish reasonable fees and may impose those fees to cover the costs of
14	administering te	sts under this chapter. All test fees collected by the state department of health
15	must be deposit	ed in the state department of health operating account.
16	SECTIO	N 7. AMENDMENT. Section 26.1-36-09.7 of the 1999 Supplement to the
17	North Dakota Ce	entury Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
18	26.1-36-	09.7. Foods and food products for inherited metabolic diseases.
19	1. As	used in this section:
20	a.	"Inherited metabolic disease" means maple syrup urine disease or
21		phenylketonuria.
22	b.	"Low-protein modified food product" means a food product that is specially
23		formulated to have less than one gram of protein per serving and is intended
24		to be used under the direction of a physician for the dietary treatment of an
25		inherited metabolic disease. The term does not include a natural food that is
26		naturally low in protein.
27	С.	"Medical food" means a food that is intended for the dietary treatment of a
28		disease or condition for which nutritional requirements are established by
29		medical evaluation and is formulated to be consumed or administered under
30		the direction of a physician.

- 1 2. An insurance company, nonprofit health service corporation, or health 2 maintenance organization may not deliver, issue, execute, or renew any health 3 insurance policy, health service contract, or evidence of coverage that provides 4 prescription coverage on an individual, group, blanket, franchise, or association 5 basis, unless the policy or contract provides, for any person covered under the 6 policy or contract, coverage for medical foods and low-protein modified food 7 products determined by a physician to be medically necessary for the therapeutic 8 treatment of an inherited metabolic disease. 9 3. This section applies to any covered individual born after December 31, 1962. This 10 section does not require coverage for low protein modified food products in excess 11 of three thousand dollars per year total for low-protein modified food products or 12 medical food for an individual with an inherited metabolic disease of amino acid or organic acid. 13
- 144. This section does not require medical benefits coverage for low protein modified15food products or medical food for an individual to the extent those benefits are16available to that individual under a state department of health or department of
- 17 <u>human services</u> program.

18 SECTION 8. A new subsection to section 50-10-06 of the North Dakota Century Code 19 is created and enacted as follows:

20 Provide medical food and low-protein modified food products under chapter 25-17
 21 to individuals with phenylketonuria or maple syrup urine disease.
