HOUSE BILL NO. 1130

1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 15-40.3-05 of the North Dakota Century Code
2 or in the alternative to amend and reenact section 15.1-31-05 of the North Dakota Century
3 Code, relating to the transportation of students participating in open enrollment.

4 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:**

5 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** If House Bill No. 1045 does not become effective, section
6 15-40.3-05 of the 1999 Supplement to the North Dakota Century Code is amended and
7 reenacted as follows:

8 **15-40.3-05. Open enrollment - Transportation.** A school district of residence may
9 provide transportation to a student participating in open enrollment. If a school district of
10 residence does not provide transportation to a student participating in open enrollment,
11 ~~transportation may be provided by the admitting district, and the~~ may petition the board of the
12 student's school district of residence for permission to transport the student. If written
13 permission is granted, the admitting district may transport the student. The admitting district is
14 then entitled to state payments for the transportation of that student.

15 **SECTION 2. AMENDMENT.** Section 15.1-31-05 of the North Dakota Century Code as
16 created by House Bill No. 1045, as approved by the fifty-seventh legislative assembly, is
17 amended and reenacted as follows:

18 **15.1-31-05. Open enrollment - Transportation.** A school district of residence may
19 provide transportation to a student participating in open enrollment. If a school district of
20 residence does not provide transportation to a student participating in open enrollment,
21 ~~transportation may be provided by the admitting district, and the~~ may petition the board of the
22 student's school district of residence for permission to transport the student. If written
23 permission is granted, the admitting district may transport the student. The admitting district is
24 then entitled to state payments for the transportation of that student.
