- 1 A BILL for an Act to provide for a developmental disability services provider reimbursement pilot
- 2 program in the southeast human service center region; and to provide an expiration date.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITY SERVICES PROVIDER
REIMBURSEMENT PILOT PROGRAM. The department of human services shall establish a
pilot program in the southeast human service region which provides for the reimbursement of
providers of services to individuals with developmental disabilities. The department may not
require any provider in the region to participate in the program. Any rules that have been
adopted by the department before January 1, 2001, regarding reimbursement of providers of
services to individuals with developmental disabilities are not applicable to any provider that
opts to participate in the pilot program. The pilot program must include the following:

- Providers must be paid on a per day or half-day rate per individual. Four or more
 hours constitutes a day and fewer than four hours constitutes a half-day. A per
 hour unit may not be used for reimbursement. The rate must be based on the cost
 for the provider to provide the service.
- 2. Reimbursement must be based on a capped "base" or "target" number system. The per day rate per person must be determined by dividing the "base" or "target" number by the number of units. Units must be determined by multiplying the number of consumers times the number of days of service.
 - Day services units must be calculated as follows: the product of two hundred thirty multiplied times the number of consumers.
 - Residential services units must be calculated as follows: the product of three hundred sixty-five times twenty-four subtracted from the product of two hundred thirty times eight.

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- 1 3. All contracts and negotiations must be between the regional human service center 2 and the provider.
 - 4. In lieu of audits, a participating provider must provide the regional human service center with a copy of the provider's annual financial report and census data.
- 5 **SECTION 2. EXPIRATION DATE.** This Act is effective through June 30, 2005, and 6 after that date is ineffective.
