- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 65-04-15 of the North Dakota Century Code,
- 2 relating to confidentiality of information in an employer's workers' compensation reports.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

**SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 65-04-15 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

65-04-15. Information in employer's reports confidential - Penalty if employee of bureau divulges information. The information contained in an employer's report is for the exclusive use and information of the bureau in the discharge of its the bureau's official duties and is not open to the public nor usable in any pending court in any action or proceeding <del>pending therein</del> unless the bureau is a party thereto to the action or proceeding. The information contained in an employer's report may be provided to a federal or state law enforcement agency pursuant to a lawful order of a court upon a showing of necessity and prior notice to the bureau of an application for the order. The information contained in the report, however, may be tabulated and published by the bureau in statistical form for the use and information of the any state departments department and of the public. Upon request, the The bureau shall disclose make available to the public the rate classification of an employer to the requester, the number of employees in each classification, and the expiration date of the premium paid by an employer; however, the bureau may not disclose any information that would reveal the amount of payroll upon which that employer's premium is being paid or the amount of premium the employer is paying. Anyone who is convicted under section 12.1-13-01 is disqualified from holding any office or employment with the bureau.

The bureau may, upon request of the state tax commissioner or the secretary of state, may furnish to them the state tax commissioner or secretary of state a list or lists of employers showing only the names, addresses, and bureau file identification numbers of such the

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1 employers as those files relate to this chapter; provided, that any such list so furnished must be 2 used by the tax commissioner or the secretary of state only for the purpose of administering 3 their duties. The bureau may provide the commissioner of labor or job service North Dakota 4 with information obtained pursuant to the administration of this title. Any information se 5 provided in administrating this title must be used only for the purpose of administering the 6 duties of the commissioner of labor or job service North Dakota. Whenever If the bureau 7 obtains information on activities of a contractor doing business in this state of which officials of 8 the secretary of state, job service North Dakota, or tax commissioner may be unaware and that 9 may be relevant to the duties of those officials, the bureau shall provide any relevant 10 information to those officials for the purpose of administering their duties. The bureau may 11 provide any state agency or a private entity with a list of names and addresses of employers for 12 the purpose of jointly publishing or distributing publications or other information pursuant to 13 section 54-06-04.3. Any, and this information so provided may only be used for the purpose of 14 jointly publishing or distributing publications or other information as provided in section 15 54-06-04.3.
