- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact eight new sections to chapter 36-14 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to indemnity for diseased animals; to amend and reenact section
- 3 36-15-08.1 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to indemnity payments for animals
- 4 diagnosed with brucellosis or bovine tuberculosis; and to repeal sections 36-15-03, 36-15-04,
- 5 36-15-06, 36-15-07, 36-15-09, and 36-15-11 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to
- 6 appraisals and condemnation of animals having brucellosis or bovine tuberculosis.

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 8 **SECTION 1.** A new section to chapter 36-14 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows:
- 10 **Definitions.** In this chapter, unless the context otherwise requires:
- "Animals" means alpaca, bison, bovine animals, farmed elk, goats, horses, llamas,
 sheep, swine, and nontraditional livestock.
- 13 2. "Board" means the state board of animal health.
- SECTION 2. A new section to chapter 36-14 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows:
- 16 Notice of condemnation of diseased animal Animal to be destroyed within
- 17 **fifteen days Extension of time.** Whenever any animal has been adjudged by the board to
- 18 <u>be diseased, the board or its authorized agent shall serve a written notice of its decision upon</u>
- 19 the owner or keeper of the animal before the condemned animal is killed. The animal must be
- 20 <u>destroyed within fifteen days after notice of condemnation, in either a federally inspected or</u>
- 21 state-inspected slaughtering plant, or under the supervision of an agent of the board. The
- 22 <u>fifteen-day period may be extended by the state veterinarian if the state veterinarian determines</u>
- 23 it advisable due to the circumstances involved in each case. The extension must be in writing.
- 24 The notice must advise the animal's owner or keeper of that person's right to protest against the

ı	diagnosis and determination of the board within twenty-lour hours after the service of the notice
2	upon the owner or keeper. If no protest is made within that time by the owner or keeper of the
3	condemned animal, the animal must be appraised in the manner provided in this chapter.
4	SECTION 3. A new section to chapter 36-14 of the North Dakota Century Code is
5	created and enacted as follows:
6	Animal condemned as diseased to be appraised by board - Notice to owner.
7	Whenever any animal has been adjudged to be diseased and ordered killed by the board, the
8	board or its authorized agent, within seven days after the entry of the order and before the
9	animal has been killed pursuant to the order, shall determine the actual value of the animal.
10	Notice of the appraisal must be given to the owner or keeper of the animal.
11	SECTION 4. A new section to chapter 36-14 of the North Dakota Century Code is
12	created and enacted as follows:
13	Protest of board's appraisal - Board of appraisers appointed - Appraisal to be
14	final. If any individual who owns or who represents the owner of any animal ordered killed
15	under this chapter is not satisfied with the appraisal by the board or its agents, the individual
16	may protest the order, and a board of three appraisers must then be formed. One member of
17	the board of appraisers must be the agent of the board, one member must be selected by the
18	owner of the animal involved, and the third member must be selected by the first two members.
19	An appraisal of the animal must be made by the board of appraisers according to section 7 of
20	this Act, and if two or more of the appraisers agree upon a certain valuation, the appraisal is
21	<u>final.</u>
22	SECTION 5. A new section to chapter 36-14 of the North Dakota Century Code is
23	created and enacted as follows:
24	Fees of appraisers - How paid. Each member of the board of appraisers who is not
25	an agent of the board is entitled to receive fifty dollars per day as compensation for services
26	rendered, plus reimbursement for expenses as provided by law for state officers. Fifty percent
27	of the amount due under this section is payable by the state board of animal health and the
28	other fifty percent is payable by the owner of the animal.
29	SECTION 6. A new section to chapter 36-14 of the North Dakota Century Code is
30	created and enacted as follows:

I	Ap	broval of indemnity payments - Rules. If the board determines that an animal is	
2	so seriously	y diseased as to warrant disposal of the animal and of all other exposed animals, the	
3	board may approve indemnity payments, as funds are appropriated, on the animals in		
4	accordance	e with the limits set in section 7 of this Act. The board may adopt rules governing	
5	indemnity p	payments under this chapter.	
6	SE	CTION 7. A new section to chapter 36-14 of the North Dakota Century Code is	
7	created and	d enacted as follows:	
8	Return of appraisal - Payment of claims for diseased animals. The return of an		
9	appraisal u	nder this chapter must be in writing and signed by the board or by the board's agent	
10	who made	the appraisal, or by the members of the board of appraisers if a reappraisal is made	
11	after a protest, and by the owner of the condemned animal. The return must be certified by the		
12	agriculture commissioner to the office of management and budget. The office of management		
13	and budget shall issue a check to the owner of the animal. The amount of indemnity paid by		
14	this state to the owner of a diseased animal may not exceed five thousand dollars per animal		
15	less any amount obtained by the owner through insurance, federal indemnity payments, or		
16	salvage payments. This state is not liable for indemnity under this chapter in excess of the		
17	amount appropriated for the payment of the indemnity by the legislative assembly and the state		
18	is not liable for indemnification of any animal killed during a biennium after the appropriation for		
19	the biennium has been exhausted.		
20	SEC	CTION 8. A new section to chapter 36-14 of the North Dakota Century Code is	
21	created and enacted as follows:		
22	Owner of diseased animals - No indemnification - Circumstances. The right of the		
23	owner of a	diseased animal to be indemnified does not exist and payment may not be made if:	
24	<u>1.</u>	The animal belongs to the United States, to this state, or to any political subdivision	
25		of this state.	
26	<u>2.</u>	The owner at the time of coming into possession of the animal knew or suspected	
27		it to be diseased.	
28	<u>3.</u>	The animal was found to have been clinically diseased at the time of its arrival in	
29		this state.	
30	<u>4.</u>	The owner is a nonresident and not engaged in the breeding of livestock in this	
31		state.	

- 1 5. The animal at the time of its killing had been in this state for less than six months.
- 2 <u>6.</u> The owner of an animal willfully exposed the animal to the disease.
- 3 <u>The owner violated any law or any rule of the board.</u>
- SECTION 9. AMENDMENT. Section 36-15-08.1 of the 1999 Supplement to the North
 Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
- 6 36-15-08.1. Owner entitled to compensation for animals infected Animals with 7 brucellosis or bovine tuberculosis - Board may make rules Compensation - Rules 8 governing payments. When, in the discretion and judgment of If the board, determines that 9 an animal is so seriously infected with brucellosis or bovine tuberculosis as to warrant disposal 10 of the animal and of all other exposed animals, the board is hereby authorized to may approve 11 indemnity payments, as funds are appropriated, en for the animals in accordance with the limits 12 set forth in section 36-15-09 7 of this Act. The board may make reasonable adopt rules 13 governing the payment of such compensation within the limits prescribed in indemnity 14 payments under this chapter.
- SECTION 10. REPEAL. Sections 36-15-03, 36-15-04, 36-15-06, 36-15-07, 36-15-09,
 and 36-15-11 of the North Dakota Century Code are repealed.
