4	have a cert	ficate of authority from the board. The authority to administer a drug by injection						
5	<u>may not be</u>	dele	delegated. The board shall adopt rules to establish educational and operational					
6	requiremen	ts for a pharmacist to obtain and maintain a certificate of authority to administer						
7	<u>drugs by inj</u>	ection. Rules adopted by the board under this section must include:						
8	<u>1.</u>	Educational requirements of a minimum of twenty hours, which include, at a

10		<u>a.</u>	Basic immunology, including the human immune response;
