- A concurrent resolution requesting that the Congress of the United States propose for ratification by the states an amendment to the Constitution of the United States relating to state legislative redistricting.

 WHEREAS, the Supreme Court of the United States has ruled that membership in both
 - WHEREAS, the Supreme Court of the United States has ruled that membership in both houses of a bicameral state legislative body must be apportioned according to population; and WHEREAS, the rulings of the Supreme Court deny to the people of the respective

states the right to establish state legislative bodies upon a pattern of representation deemed suitable to the needs of each state or similar to the pattern deemed advantageous for the Congress of the United States and provided by the Constitution of the United States; and

WHEREAS, the actions of the Supreme Court have restricted the ability of the citizens of states to designate the manner in which they are represented in their respective legislative bodies and have deprived the people of their right to determine how they are to be governed;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF NORTH DAKOTA, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING THEREIN:

That the Fifty-seventh Legislative Assembly urges the Congress of the United States to propose to the several states for ratification an amendment to the Constitution of the United States to allow states to apportion one house of state legislative bodies on factors other than population; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Secretary of State forward copies of this resolution to the Speaker of the United States House of Representatives, the President of the United States Senate, and the members of the North Dakota Congressional Delegation.
