1 A concurrent resolution directing the Legislative Council to study the feasibility and desirability 2 of establishing a putative fathers' adoption registry. 3 WHEREAS, a "putative father" is a man who may be a child's father, but who was not 4 married to the child's mother before the child was born and has not established the fact that he 5 is the father in a court proceeding; 6 WHEREAS, in most cases, North Dakota law requires that both parents give consent to 7 an adoption; and 8 WHEREAS, a putative fathers' adoption registry could serve to protect the legal rights of 9 the father as well as simplify the process for families that want to adopt and for adoption social 10 workers and other professionals who must make sure that a child is "legally free" for adoption; 11 and 12 WHEREAS, a number of states, including Alabama, Arizona, Georgia, Idaho, Illinois, 13 Indiana, Iowa, Kansas, Kentucky, Louisiana, Massachusetts, Minnesota, Missouri, and New 14 Mexico have enacted legislation to create a putative fathers' adoption registry;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF NORTH DAKOTA, THE SENATE CONCURRING THEREIN:

- That the Legislative Council study the feasibility and desirability of establishing a putative fathers' adoption registry; and
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Legislative Council report its findings and recommendations, together with any legislation required to implement the recommendations, to the Fifty-eighth Legislative Assembly.
