1	A concurrent resolution to encourage the Secretary of State to appoint a committee to conduct
2	a comprehensive study of North Dakota election laws.
3	WHEREAS, it has been at least 10 years since the last comprehensive study of election
4	laws in this state; and
5	WHEREAS, the presidential controversy debacle in Florida illustrates the need for
6	regular comprehensive reviews of election laws and procedures; and
7	WHEREAS, rapidly evolving election technologies are paving the way for dramatic
8	changes in voting and election procedures; and
9	WHEREAS, the Secretary of State, in his role as the state's chief election officer, is the
10	individual best suited to undertake a comprehensive study of election laws in this state;
11	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES
12	OF NORTH DAKOTA, THE SENATE CONCURRING THEREIN:
13	That the Legislative Assembly encourages the Secretary of State to appoint a
14	committee to conduct a comprehensive study of North Dakota election laws; and
15	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that if the Secretary of State appoints such a committee,
16	the committee should include representation from cities, counties, townships, school districts,
17	political parties, voter advocacy groups, disability groups, and the technology sector; and
18	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that if the Secretary of State appoints such a committee,
19	the Legislative Council be authorized to appoint up to four members of the Legislative
20	Assembly to the committee, with members from the majority and minority parties and from the
21	House of Representatives and the Senate; and
22	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that if the Secretary of State appoints such a committee,
23	the committee conclude its deliberations so that the Secretary of State may recommend any
24	necessary statutory changes to the Fifty-eighth Legislative Assembly.
