SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 4026

1 A concurrent resolution urging Congress to address the flaws in the current freedom to farm 2 legislation, to support legislation such as the farm income and trade equity act introduced by 3 Senator Conrad, which would restore income protection for this nation's farmers, and to support 4 proposals put forth by Senator Dorgan and Congressman Pomeroy, which would correct the 5 loan rate formulas of the current freedom to farm legislation. 6 WHEREAS, the prices for many commodities grown by farmers in this state have for 7 several years been at historically low levels; and 8 WHEREAS, emergency government assistance payments to farmers in this state have 9 over the last three years exceeded \$1 billion; and 10 WHEREAS, in 1996, government subsidies accounted for 13 percent of total farm 11 income; and 12 WHEREAS, in 1999, government subsidies accounted for 42 percent of total farm 13 income: and 14 WHEREAS, statistics released by the Food and Agricultural Policy Research Institute at 15 the University of Missouri indicate that if the current agricultural policy is not changed, net farm 16 income will by the year 2009 fall to \$37 billion, which is \$17 billion less than the 1996 level; and 17 WHEREAS, freedom to farm legislation eliminated the countercyclical price protection 18 for farmers that was a mainstay of earlier farm programs and agricultural policy; 19 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF NORTH DAKOTA, THE 20 HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING THEREIN: 21 That the Fifty-seventh Legislative Assembly urges the Congress of the United States to 22 address the flaws in the current freedom to farm legislation, to support legislation such as the 23 Farm Income and Trade Equity Act introduced by Senator Conrad, which would restore income 24 protection for this nation's farmers, and to support proposals put forth by Senator Dorgan and
