1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the public service

2 commission; and to amend and reenact section 49-01-05 of the North Dakota Century Code,

3 relating to the salary of public service commissioners.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

5 **SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION.** The funds provided in this section, or so much of the 6 funds as may be necessary, are hereby appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in 7 the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from special funds derived from federal 8 funds and other income, to the public service commission for the purpose of defraying the 9 expenses of the public service commission, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2001, and 10 ending June 30, 2003, as follows: 11 \$4,634,173 Salaries and wages 12 Operating expenses 1,185,662 13 86,961 Equipment 14 Grants 39,150

- 19 SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 49-01-05 of the 1999 Supplement to the North 20 Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

21 49-01-05. Salary of commissioners. The annual salary of a commissioner is 22 fifty-eight sixty-six thousand two five hundred sixty-two nine dollars through June 30, 2000 23 December 31, 2001, fifty-nine sixty-eight thousand four five hundred twenty-eight four dollars through December 31, 2000 June 30, 2002, and sixty-four sixty-nine thousand five eight 24

- 1 hundred sixty-nine seventy-four dollars thereafter. All fees received or charged by any
- 2 commissioner for any act or service rendered in any official capacity must be accounted for and
- 3 paid over by the commissioner monthly to the state treasurer and must be credited to the
