	funds as may be necessary, are appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state		
7	treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from special funds derived from federal funds and		
8	other income, to the department of corrections and rehabilitation for the purpose of defraying		
9	the expenses of its various divisions, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2001, and ending		
10	June 30, 2003, as follows:

20	SECTION 2. LAND BOARD DISTRIBUTIONS. The estimated income line item in		
21	subdivision 2 of section 1 of this Act includes \$502,823 from permanent funds managed for the		
22	benefit of the youth correctional center by the board of university and school lands.		
23	SECTION 3. LINE ITEM TRANSFER AUTHORITY. The director of the department of		
24	corrections and rehabilitation may transfer from the salary and wages line item in subdivision 1		
25	of section 1 of this Act to various line items in subdivisions 2 and 3 of section 1 of this Act		
26	appropriation authority of up to \$125,000 to provide for salary equity adjustments.		
27	SECTION 4. AUTHORITY TO LEASE LAND UNDER THE JURISDICTION OF THE		
28	<b>DEPARTMENT.</b> The department of corrections and rehabilitation may lease land under the		
29	jurisdiction of the department for the purpose of the construction and operation of a prerelease		
30	center. Subsection 12 of section 54-23.3-04 does not apply to the lease authorized by this		
31	section. The lease expires when the leased property is no longer used for a prerelease center,		

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- when the lease operator breaches any material part of the lease, or twenty years after the date of the lease, whichever occurs first, and all rights, title, and interest in any buildings, fixtures, and improvements vest and remain with the state.
  - SECTION 5. CORRECTIONAL SYSTEM LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL STUDY. During the 2001-02 interim, the legislative council shall consider studying the correctional system in North Dakota, including its functions, responsibilities, and funding; causes for increases in the state's inmate population; types of offenders and offender programs; cost-effectiveness of programs; operation, efficiency, and effectiveness of prison industries programs; rates of recidivism; possible alternatives to incarceration which may reduce the number of inmates and reduce recidivism; and the effectiveness of sentencing laws, incarceration, and treatment. The legislative council shall report its findings and recommendations, together with any legislation required to implement the recommendations, to the fifty-eighth legislative assembly.
