- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact subsection 7 of section 21-03-07 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to general obligation bonds that may be issued by the governing body of
- 3 a school district without a vote upon the question of the issuance of the bonds.

## 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

**SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Subsection 7 of section 21-03-07 of the 1999 Supplement to the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

The governing body of any public school district may also by resolution adopted by a two-thirds vote dedicate the tax levies as authorized by section 15-51-11, <del>15-51-13, or</del> 57-15-16 or 57-15-17.1 and may authorize and issue general obligation bonds to be paid by these dedicated levies for the purpose of providing funds for the purchase, construction, reconstruction, remodeling, or repair of public school buildings or for the construction or improvement of a project pursuant to chapter 15-60. The initial resolution authorizing the tax levy dedication and general obligation bonds must be published in the official newspaper of the school district, and any owner of taxable property within the school district may, within sixty days after publication, file with the business manager of the school district a protest against the adoption of the resolution. Protests must be in writing and must describe the property that is the subject of the protest. If the governing body finds the protests to have been signed by the owners of taxable property having an assessed valuation equal to five percent or more of the assessed valuation of all taxable property within the school district, as theretofore last finally equalized, all further proceedings under the initial resolution are barred.
