BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

7 SECTION 1. A new subsection to section 20.1-02-05 of the 1999 Supplement to the 8 North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows: 9 Issue, as a means of rewarding dedication to teaching firearm hunter safety, 10 complimentary lifetime resident certificates provided under section 3 of this Act and 11 combination licenses provided under section 20.1-03-11.1 to resident certified 12 hunter education volunteer instructors. Eligible persons must have served as a 13 lead or assistant certified hunter education volunteer instructor in this state for a 14 minimum of one course in each of thirty years. The license is known as the 15 "lifetime combination license" and must be signed by the director and the person 16 receiving the license. The license must be revoked by the director if the 17 licenseholder is convicted of a felony or found to have violated any provision of this 18 title. 19 SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Subsection 18 of section 20.1-03-12 of the 1999

Supplement to the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

18. For a permit to ship, by a person having a resident hunting license, during the respective open seasons, not to exceed in any one season twenty-five game birds, to points within this state other than that person's home or to points outside this state, three dollars. For a resident certificate fee, one dollar, and for a nonresident

1	certificate fee, two dollars. An agent may not charge a service fee for issuing a
2	resident or nonresident certificate fee.
3	SECTION 3. A new subsection to section 20.1-03-12 of the 1999 Supplement to the
4	North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows:
5	For a resident certificate fee, one dollar, and for a nonresident certificate fee, two
6	dollars. An agent may not charge a service fee for issuing a resident or
7	nonresident certificate fee.
