1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact section 15.1-06-08.1 of the North Dakota Century Code, 2 relating to the waiver of statutes; and to amend and reenact sections 15.1-06-05 and 3 15.1-06-08 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the reconfiguration of instructional 4 days and the waiver of accreditation rules. 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA: 6 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 15.1-06-05 of the 1999 Supplement to the North 7 Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows: 8 15.1-06-05. Sehool calendar - Modification Instructional days - Reconfiguration -9 Application. A school district may apply to the superintendent of public instruction for approval 10 of a pilot program in which the district's school calendar is reduced below one hundred eighty 11 days. 12 1. The superintendent may approve an application for a pilot program if: 13 It allows the district to evaluate the modifications in the traditional school <del>a.</del> 14 calendar from the perspective of increased school facility use; and 15 In the opinion of the superintendent, the program offers educational opportunities equivalent to those available in a one-hundred-eighty-day 16 17 school calendar. 18 <del>2.</del> A district submitting an application under this section shall specify: 19 The minimum number of days students will attend school; and a.

Conditions Rules for school accreditation and approval - Waiver. The 12 A school or school district may apply to the superintendent of public instruction 13 may waive any condition for a waiver of any rule governing the accreditation and 14 approval for a reasonable period of time of schools, provided the waiver 15 encourages: 16 Encourages innovation, permits experimentation, and has <u>a.</u> 17 <u>b.</u> Has the potential to result in an improved program. The superintendent may 18 waive the conditions only with the concurrence of a majority of a waiver 19 committee composed of one member appointed by the North Dakota 20 education association, one member appointed by the North Dakota council of 21 educational leaders, and one member appointed by the North Dakota school 22 boards association educational opportunities or enhanced academic 23 opportunities for the students. 24 2. The initial waiver must be for a specific period of time, but may not exceed one 25 year. A school or a school district for which a waiver has been approved under 26 this section, may apply for one extension of the waiver. The extension may not 27 exceed one year. 28 If the superintendent of public instruction, after receipt and consideration of an <u>3.</u> 29 application for a waiver of a rule governing the accreditation of schools under this 30 section approves the waiver, the superintendent shall file a report with a committee 31 designated by the legislative council. The report must cite the accreditation rule
