- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 12-44.1 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to inmate accounts, payment of inmate financial obligations, and
- 3 payment for medical and health care costs.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. A new section to chapter 12-44.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows:

Establishment of inmate accounts - Withholding funds for inmate financial obligations - Health care costs - Payment of funds to inmate upon release.

- 1. The correctional facility administrator may establish an inmate account for each inmate. Not more than fifty percent of the earnings and funds an inmate receives while incarcerated in a correctional facility may be withheld from an inmate and deposited in a separate account for the inmate and may not be made available to the inmate until the inmate's release from the correctional facility, except as otherwise authorized by the correctional facility administrator. The remainder of an inmate's earnings must be made available to the inmate on a regular basis.
- 2. The correctional facility administrator may withdraw funds from an inmate's account to meet the inmate's legitimate financial obligations, including child support and restitution. The correctional facility administrator may withdraw funds from the inmate's account to pay for the inmate's medical, dental, and eye care costs while the inmate is incarcerated in the correctional facility. Before the funds may be withdrawn, the inmate must first receive written notice and be provided a hearing with the right to correctional facility staff assistance and the right to review by the correctional facility administrator.

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1 A correctional facility administrator may collect fees from inmates to offset health 2 care costs as follows: 3 a. For sick call charges, up to five dollars per sick call. 4 b. For self-inflicted injuries, the total amount of medical costs incurred. 5 For necessary health care services, the correctional facility may seek C. reimbursement from the inmate up to the total amount of health care costs 6 7 incurred. If the inmate has health insurance coverage, a medical or health 8 care provider must file a claim for reimbursement from the health insurance 9 coverage carrier. 10 d. For elective health care requested by an inmate and as allowed by 11 correctional facility policy, the inmate is responsible for the amount of the costs incurred. 12 13 A correctional facility may not deny necessary and nonelective medical and e. 14 health care to an inmate who does not have health insurance or does not 15 have the ability to pay the costs of the medical or health care. 16 4. The correctional facility administrator shall pay an inmate all funds in the inmate's 17 account when the inmate is discharged from the correctional facility or when the 18 inmate is transferred to another correctional facility, less the inmate's outstanding 19 obligations to the correctional facility.
