1 A concurrent resolution urging Congress to eliminate the marriage penalty.

2 **WHEREAS**, marriage is recognized throughout the nation as a valuable and important

3 social institution; and

4 WHEREAS, families today struggle with the high costs of raising children; and

5 WHEREAS, our current tax code imposes a tax penalty on married couples, often

6 referred to as a marriage penalty; and

7 WHEREAS, the current marriage penalty in some cases encourages married couples to

8 divorce to avoid taxes; and

9 WHEREAS, the current marriage penalty in some cases discourages single persons
10 from becoming married; and

11 WHEREAS, Congressman Earl Pomeroy has proposed federal legislation by

introducing HR 5171 in the 106th Congress, second session, to address the marriage taxpenalty;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF NORTH DAKOTA, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING THEREIN:

That the Fifty-seventh Legislative Assembly urges the Congress of the United States to support and pass Congressman Pomeroy's proposed legislation to eliminate the marriage tax penalty so that families will not be punished under the tax code, those who chose to become married will not be encouraged to dissolve their marriage to avoid federal taxes, and those who are contemplating marriage will not resolve to remain unmarried because of the marriage tax penalty; and
BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Secretary of State forward copies of this
