

HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 3073

1 A concurrent resolution urging the state's congressional delegation to support and work to
2 enact the tax relief proposal introduced by President Bush.

3 **WHEREAS**, President George W. Bush honored the state of North Dakota with his visit
4 to the state on Thursday, March 8, 2001; and

5 **WHEREAS**, federal taxes are the highest they have ever been during peacetime; and

6 **WHEREAS**, all taxpayers should be allowed to keep more of their own money; and

7 **WHEREAS**, the best way to encourage economic growth is to cut marginal tax rates
8 across all tax brackets; and

9 **WHEREAS**, President Bush, on his visit to North Dakota, pledged his commitment to
10 end the estate tax, commonly known as the death tax; and

11 **WHEREAS**, under current tax law, low-income workers often pay the highest marginal
12 rates; and

13 **WHEREAS**, President Bush's tax relief plan will contribute to raising the standard of
14 living for all Americans; and

15 **WHEREAS**, President Bush's tax relief plan will increase access to the middle class for
16 hard-working families, treat all middle-class families more fairly, encourage entrepreneurship
17 and growth, and promote charitable giving and education; and

18 **WHEREAS**, under President Bush's tax relief plan, the largest percentage reductions
19 will go to the lowest-income earners;

20 **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES**
21 **OF NORTH DAKOTA, THE SENATE CONCURRING THEREIN:**

22 That the Fifty-seventh Legislative Assembly urges the state's congressional delegation
23 to support and work to enact the tax relief proposal introduced by President Bush; and

24 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that the Secretary of State forward copies of this
25 resolution to each member of the North Dakota Congressional Delegation, the Senate Majority
