## COMMUNICATION FROM SECRETARY OF STATE ALVIN A. JAEGER December 5, 2000

According to the provisions of Section 54-03-03 of the North Dakota Century Code, the Chief Clerk of the North Dakota House of Representatives, "at the opening of each organizational session, shall make a correct roll of the members" of the House of Representatives "to whom Certificates of Election have been issued by the proper officers."

Section 16.1-15-45 of the North Dakota Century Code provides that Certificates of Election are prepared by the Secretary of State and signed by the Governor, Secretary of State, and a member of the State Canvassing Board. In Section 16.1-15-46, the Secretary of State is instructed to issue "certificates of election to all members of the legislative assembly."

In accordance with the above referenced sections of law, I hereby certify that the attached is a true and correct listing of Representatives elected in the General and Special Elections, which were held on November 7, 2000. The results were certified in meetings of the State Canvassing Board held on November 21, 2000, and on December 4, 2000.

A Certificate of Election (copies enclosed) has been issued to each person named on the attached listing.

In addition, in accordance with the provisions of Section 4, Article XI, of the North Dakota Constitution, an Oath of Office (or affirmation) form was provided to each Representative, with instructions to execute it before a Notary Public and file it with the Secretary of State before they assume the duties of their new position.
