Fifty-seventh Legislative Assembly

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Bismarck, January 12, 2001

The Senate convened at 12:30 p.m., with President Dalrymple presiding.

A quorum was declared by the President.

CONSIDERATION OF AMENDMENTS

SB 2136: SEN. KELSH (Education Committee) MOVED that the amendments on SJ page 57 be adopted and then be placed on the Eleventh order with DO PASS, which motion prevailed.

MOTION

Was read the first time and referred to the Finance and Taxation Committee.

SB 2194: A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 6-09-15.5 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to Bank of North Dakota loans to beginning farmers.

SB 2195: A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation to the department of tourism for a grant to the North Dakota cowboy hall of fame.

SB 2198: A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new subsection to section 54-52-04, a new subsection to section 54-52.1-01, and five new sections to chapter 54-52.1 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the expansion of the uniform group insurance program to allow participation by permanent and temporary employees of private sector employers and by any other person who is otherwise without health insurance coverage; to amend and reenact section 54-52.1-02 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to subgroups under the uniform group insurance program; to provide an appropriation; and to provide an effective date.

Was read the first time and referred to the Industry, Bus iness and Labor Committee.

Sens. Klein, D. Mathern and Reps. Delmore, R. Kelsch introduced:

SB 2199: A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 43-13-13.3 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to optometrist treatment of primary open-angle glaucoma.

Was read the first time and referred to the Human Services Committee.

Sens. Krauter, Freborg, G. Nelson and Reps. Belter, Kerzman, Monson introduced:

SB 2200: A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact subsection 2 of section 14 of chapter 169 of the 1999 Session Laws, relating to school district reorganization bonuses; to provide an appropriation; and to declare an emergency.

Was read the first time and referred to the Education Committee.

Sen. Traynor and Reps. Brekke, Nicholas introduced:

SB 2201: A BILL for an Act to provide for the removal of a future interest and a covenant from deeds transferring land from this state to the Devils Lake public school district No. 1.

Was read the first time and referred to the Judiciary Committee.

Sens. Traynor, Cook, Holmberg and Reps. D. Johnson, R. Kelsch introduced:

SB 2202: A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 15-34.1-01 of the North Dakota Century Code or in the alternative to amend and reenact section 15.1-20-01 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the compulsory attendance of students.

Was read the first time and referred to the Education Committee.

Sens. Nichols, D. Mathern, Trenbeath and Reps. Jensen, Thorpe, Warner introduced:

SB 2203: A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 39-04 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to motor vehicle number plates bearing college or university logos.

Was read the first time and referred to the Transportation Committee.

Sens. Nichols, Erbele, Tomac and Reps. Boehm, Nelson, Rennerfeldt introduced:

SB 2204: A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact subsection 1 of section 4-09-14 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to noxious weed seeds.

Was read the first time and referred to the Agriculture Committee.

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FIRST READING OF SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

Sens. Klein, Cook, Tomac and Reps. Berg, Wald introduced:

SCR 4008: A concurrent resolution urging the Public Service Commission, Qwest Corporation, and the Federal Communications Commission to proceed as quickly as possible with the process of allowing Qwest Corporation to provide interstate telecommunications services.

Was read the first time and referred to the Industry, Business and Labor Committee.

The Senate stood adjourned pursuant to Senator Christmann's motion.
