MEMORIAL ADDRESS BY FORMER LIEUTENANT GOVERNOR ROSEMARIE MYRDAL addies and gentlemen, members of the Senate, and family members of the senators who are

Ladies and gentlemen, members of the Senate, and family members of the senators who are being remembered and honored here today:

We are reading the names and are thinking about the senators who have died in the past year. We are here to reflect upon their lives, our associations with them, and especially the meaning of their service to the State of North Dakota as senators.

Each of these senators earned the confidence of their fellow citizens. They were elected to serve from districts across the state, often in competitive campaigns. And each of them seeking reelection after four years asked citizens to vote for them - approving of their work. Some served several terms, others just one or two, but they all experienced the sacrifice that is involved in holding state office - absence from the workplace, family separation, time spent working with citizens who needed help. During the sessions, the stress of inactivity, long hours in committee meetings, and the pressures of an intense schedule take a toll. Each of the senators being honored today also lived with a sense of responsibility for the effects of laws passed and the difficult decisions impacting the lives of the people they represented.

During the eight years I served as President of the Senate, I had the opportunity to observe the senators on the floor and voting. The debates over contentious issues were carried out with civility and dignity. Senators know how to disagree without being disrespectful. Participation in the Senate sessions and committee hearings tests character and intellect. The work of a senator requires reading, listening, discussing, reflection on values, and the defense of decisions before critical constituents. It often helps to have a sense of humor, too.

But life as a senator also brings rewards. There is a sense of pride in being introduced as a North Dakota Senator. And through the year, people who serve in the legislature can see the positive results of laws passed and the development of good, honest government under law. The time spent together today also reminds us of a reward that becomes part of the life of the senator and the life of the family - lifelong friendships.

In this past year, we have faced the end of life on this earth. We cannot escape the grief, regrets, loneliness, and sometimes painful memories. And, we share a search for comfort and meaning seeking strength and guidance in prayer and God's grace. And so today, as we share friendship and honor the memory of the senators who have died this past year, let us remember this:.

Their lives continue to be an inspiration for those who serve in the Senate today. The work they did continues to be of value to the citizens of North Dakota. And so, as you miss your senator and grieve - please accept this memorial tribute as an expression of appreciation from the citizens of the State of North Dakota.

Thank you for inviting me to be here today. I do appreciate the opportunity to participate in this special service.

HCR 3065: A concurrent resolution directing the Legislative Council to study the negative impact due to diminishing rail access and service, the cost to industry, business, and communities of shifting rail services to state and local highway systems, and the feasibility and desirability of funding enhanced rail facilities including an intermodal rail facility in this state.

Was read the first time and referred to the Transportation Committee.

The Senate stood adjourned pursuant to Senator Christmann's motion.
