The fiscal notes indicates that as a result of the bill, the department will collect additional revenue of \$61,978 per biennium. The House added \$138,144 for one FTE and other costs relating to House Bill No. 1273. The conference committee amendment adds \$85,517 for a .5 FTE and related costs.
