State law now mandates that all expenses of the State Board of Accountancy are to be paid from fees it collects. In which case, they could expect an initial expense of approximately \$200 (for the initial accounting examination, plus an ethics exam), an annual registration fee of \$45, and perhaps annual costs involved with continuing education.
