1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 15.1-21-02 of the North Dakota Century Code,

2 relating to high school course offerings.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

4 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 15.1-21-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is 5 amended and reenacted as follows:

 7 1. In order to be approved by the superintendent of public
 - In order to be approved by the superintendent of public instruction, each public and nonpublic high school shall make available to each student school year at least:
- 9 1. Four units

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- 10a.One unit of English- language arts, which meets or exceeds the state content11standards, at each grade level from nine through twelve;
- 12 2. Three units
- b. <u>One unit</u> of mathematics., which meets or exceeds the state content
 standards, at each grade level from nine through twelve;
- 15 3. Four units
- 16c.One unit of science-, which meets or exceeds the state content standards, at17each grade level from nine through twelve;
- 18 4. Three units
- 19d.One unitof social studies, including one of world history and one of United20States history, both of which must emphasize geography.
- 21 5. One which meets or exceeds the state content standards, at each grade level from
 22 nine through twelve;
- 23 <u>e.</u> <u>One-half</u> unit of health and physical education.
- 24 6. One unit of music.

17			make course selections from a list that includes at least the course or unit
18			requirements set forth in subsection 1;
19		<u>b.</u>	If a student selects a course or unit from the list required by subsection 1, the
20			public high school or the nonpublic high school must provide the course to the
21			student; and
22		<u>C.</u>	The course or unit may be provided to the student through any delivery
23			method not contrary to state law and may include classroom or individual
24			instruction and distance learning options, including interactive video, computer
25			instruction, correspondence courses, and postsecondary enrollment under
26			chapter 15.1-25.
27	<u>3.</u>	<u>The</u>	e board of a school district may not impose any fees or charges upon a student
28		for	the provision of or participation in courses or units as provided in this section,

1	<u>4.</u>	If in order to meet the minimum course requirements of this section a school district
2		includes academic courses offered by a postsecondary institution under chapter
3		15.1-25, the school district must:
4		a. Pay all costs of the student's attendance, except those fees that are
5		permissible under section 15.1-09-36; and
6		b. Transport the student to and from the location at which the course is offered
7		or provide mileage reimbursement to the student if transportation is provided
8		by the student or the student's family.
