- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact sections 43-12.1-02, 43-12.1-03, 43-12.1-04,
- 2 43-12.1-05, 43-12.1-07, 43-12.1-08, 43-12.1-09, 43-12.1-10, 43-12.1-11, 43-12.1-13,
- 3 43-12.1-14, 43-12.1-15, and 43-12.1-16 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to specialty
- 4 nursing practice, unlicensed assistive personnel, persons exempt from licensure, residency
- 5 requirements for nursing practice, compensation of board members, disciplinary procedures,
- 6 and the expiration date of the authority of a licensed nurse to delegate medication
- 7 administration.

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

9 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 43-12.1-02 of the 1999 Supplement to the North
10 Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

43-12.1-02. Definitions. In this chapter, unless the context or subject matter otherwise
requires:

- 131. "Advanced practice registered nurse" means a person who holds a current license14to practice in this state as an advanced practice registered nurse and either has a15graduate degree with a nursing focus or has completed the educational
- 16 requirements in effect when the person was initially licensed.
- 17 2. "Board" means the North Dakota board of nursing.
- 3. "Licensed practical nurse" means a person who holds a current license to practice
 in this state as a licensed practical nurse and either has an associate degree with
 a major in nursing or has completed the educational requirements in effect when
 the person was initially licensed.
- 4. "Nurse" means any person currently licensed as an advanced practice registered
 nurse, registered nurse, or licensed practical nurse.

1		5.	"Nurse assistant" means a person who is authorized by the board to perform
2			nursing tasks delegated and supervised by a licensed nurse.
3		6.	"Nursing" means the performance of acts utilizing specialized knowledge, skills,
4			and abilities for people in a variety of settings. Nursing includes the following acts,
5			which may not be deemed to include acts of medical diagnosis or treatment or the
6			practice of medicine as defined in chapter 43-17:
7			a. The maintenance of health and prevention of illness.
8			b. Diagnosing human responses to actual or potential health problems.
9			c. Providing supportive and restorative care and nursing treatment, medication
10			administration, health counseling and teaching, case finding and referral of
11			persons who are ill, injured, or experiencing changes in the normal health
12			processes.
13			d. Administration, teaching, supervision, delegation, and evaluation of health
14			and nursing practices.
15			e. Collaboration with other health care professionals in the implementation of the
16			total health care regimen and execution of the health care regimen prescribed
17			by a health care practitioner licensed under title 43.
18	7.	<u>6.</u>	"Prescriptive practices" means assessing the need for drugs, immunizing agents,
19			or devices and writing a prescription to be filled by a licensed pharmacist.
20	8.	<u>7.</u>	"Registered nurse" means a person who holds a current license to practice in this
21			state as a registered nurse and either has a baccalaureate degree with a major in
22			nursing or has completed the educational requirements in effect when the person
23			was initially licensed.
24		<u>8.</u>	"Specialty practice registered nurse" means a person who holds a current license
25			to practice in this state as a specialty practice registered nurse and has the
26			educational preparation and national certification within a defined area of nursing
27			practice.
28		<u>9.</u>	"Transitional practical nurse license" means a license issued by the board to a
29			person who meets all of the requirements for licensure by endorsement as a
30			licensed practical nurse, except the educational requirements.

1	<u>10.</u>	"Transitional registered nurse license" means a license issued by the board to a
2		person who meets all of the requirements for licensure by endorsement as a
3		registered nurse, except the educational requirements.

4 "Unlicensed assistive person" means an assistant to the nurse who regardless of 11. 5 title is authorized by the board to perform nursing interventions delegated and 6 supervised by a licensed nurse.

7 SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 43-12.1-03 of the 1999 Supplement to the North 8 Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

9 43-12.1-03. License required - Title - Abbreviation. Any person who provides 10 nursing care to a resident of this state must hold a current license or registration issued by the 11 board. It is unlawful for a person to practice nursing, offer to practice nursing, assist in the 12 practice of nursing, or use any title, abbreviation, or designation to indicate that the person is 13 practicing nursing or assisting in the practice of nursing in this state unless that person is 14 currently licensed or registered under this chapter. A currently licensed advanced practice 15 registered nurse or specialty practice registered nurse may use titles approved by the board; a 16 currently licensed registered nurse may use the abbreviation "R.N."; a currently licensed 17 practical nurse may use the abbreviation "L.P.N."; and a nurse assistant an unlicensed 18 assistive person with current registration may use the title identified by the employer. A person 19 may not use the title "nurse" or be referred to as a "nurse" unless licensed by the board. 20 SECTION 3. AMENDMENT. Section 43-12.1-04 of the 1999 Supplement to the North 21 Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows: 22 43-12.1-04. (Effective through July 31, 2001) Persons exempt from provisions of 23 **chapter.** This chapter does not apply to: 24 1. Persons who perform nursing tasks interventions in cases of emergency or 25 disaster. 26 2. Students practicing nursing as a part of a board-approved nursing education 27 program. 28 3. Legally licensed nurses of another state employed in this state by the United 29 States government or any of its bureaus, divisions, or agencies. 30 4. A nurse licensed by another state or Canada, whose employment requires the 31 nurse to accompany and care for a patient in transit for health care.

11	14.	Establish a nursing student loan program funded by license fees to encourage
12		persons to enter and advance in the nursing profession.
13	15.	Establish a registry of persons licensed or registered by the board.
14	16.	Collaborate and consult with the North Dakota nurses association, North Dakota
15		licensed practical nurses association, and other nursing specialty groups prior to
16		the adoption of rules.
17	17.	Report annually to the governor and nursing profession regarding the regulation of
18		nursing in the state.

28	requirement	ts of this section is entitled to initial licensure or registration as follows:
29	1.	An applicant for licensure by examination to practice as a registered nurse or
30		licensed practical nurse shall:

1		a. Submit a completed application and appropriate fee as established by the
2		board;
3		b. Submit an official transcript showing completion of a board-approved nursing
4		education program preparing for the level of licensure sought; and
5		c. Pass an examination approved by the board.
6	2.	An applicant for licensure by endorsement to practice as a registered nurse or
7		licensed practical nurse shall:
8		a. Submit a completed application and appropriate fee as established by the
9		board;
10		b. Submit an official transcript showing completion of a nursing education
11		program equal to or exceeding the requirements for nursing education
12		programs in place in this state at the time the applicant qualified for initial
13		licensure;
14		c. Submit proof of initial licensure by examination with the examination meeting
15		the state requirements for licensure examinations in effect at the time the
16		applicant qualified for initial licensure; and
17		d. Submit evidence of current unencumbered licensure in another state or
18		territory or meet continued competency requirements as established by the
19		board.
20	3.	If an applicant for licensure by endorsement does not meet the educational
21		requirements for the appropriate level of licensure as established by the board, a
22		transitional license may be issued. A transitional license may be issued and
23		renewed according to board rules. Renewal requires proof of progression towards
24		meeting the educational academic requirements or thirty hours of continuing
25		education.

27		a. Submit a completed application and appropriate fee as established by the
28		board;
29		b. Submit evidence of appropriate education and current certification in an
30		advanced nursing role by a national nursing organization meeting criteria as

12			a.	Submit a completed application and the appropriate fee as established by the
13				board; and
14			b.	Provide verification of appropriate training and, evidence of certification or
15				evaluation in the performance of basic nursing tasks interventions.

17			<u>a.</u>	Submit a completed application and appropriate fees as established by the
18				board;

A nurse assistant <u>An unlicensed assistive person</u> may renew registration upon
 submission of a renewal application, <u>appropriate fee established by the board</u> and
 documentation of competency by the employer <u>or evidence of certification or</u>
 <u>evaluation</u>. A lapsed nurse assistant <u>unlicensed assistive person</u> registration may
 be renewed upon submission of the application, payment of the <u>appropriate</u> fee
 <u>established by the board</u>, and documentation of competency <u>or evidence of</u>
 <u>certification or evaluation</u>.

SECTION 9. AMENDMENT. Section 43-12.1-11 of the 1999 Supplement to the North
Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

12 43-12.1-11. Duties of licensees and registrants. Each person licensed or registered 13 by the board shall provide information requested by the board at the time of renewal. Each 14 person licensed or registered by the board shall report to the board any knowledge of the 15 performance by others of those acts or omissions that are violations of this chapter or grounds 16 for disciplinary action as set forth in section 43-12.1-14. Each licensed nurse licensee or 17 registrant shall report to the board any judgment or settlement in a professional or occupational 18 malpractice action to which the licensee or registrant is a party. Any person, other than a 19 licensee or registrant alleged to have violated this chapter, participating in good faith in making 20 a report, assisting in an investigation, or furnishing information to an investigator, is immune 21 from any civil or criminal liability that otherwise may result from reporting required by this 22 section. For the purpose of any civil or criminal proceeding the good faith of any person 23 required to report under this section is presumed.

SECTION 10. AMENDMENT. Section 43-12.1-13 of the 1999 Supplement to the North
 Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

43-12.1-13. Disciplinary proceedings. Disciplinary proceedings under this chapter
must be conducted in accordance with chapter 28-32. Fees of up to one thousand dollars for
each separate violation or the assessment of costs and disbursements, or both, may be
imposed against a respondent in addition to any licensure or registration sanctions the board
may impose. An appeal from the final decision of the board may be taken to the district court of
Burleigh County under chapter 28-32. The board shall furnish to the boards of nursing of other

12	situations in	volving impairments of chemical dependency or psychiatric or physical disorders; or

23	4.	Has obtained or attempted to obtain by fraud or deceit a license or registration to

26	5.	Is unfit or incompetent to practice nursing by reason of negligence, patterns of			
27		behavior, or other causes as established under rules adopted by the board Has			
28		engaged in a pattern of practice or other behavior that demonstrates professional

31		substances for personal use or unauthorized use;

14		to obtain a license in this state or assist others in the performance of these acts.	
15	3.	Practice as an advanced practice registered nurse, a specialty practice registered	
16		nurse, a registered nurse, or a licensed practical nurse through use of a transcript	
17		from a school of nursing, diploma, certificate of registration, license, or record	
18		which was fraudulently created or obtained.	
19	4.	Practice as an advanced practice registered nurse, a specialty practice registered	
20		nurse, a registered nurse, or a licensed practical nurse as defined by this chapter	
21		unless licensed to do so.	
22	5.	Conduct any education program preparing a person for nursing licensure or	
23		registration unless the program has been approved or accepted by the board.	
24	6.	Employ a person to practice nursing or perform nursing tasks interventions unless	
25		the person is licensed or registered by the board.	
26	Any violatio	n of this chapter is a class B misdemeanor.
