SB 2408 changes the taxation of tobacco products from 28% of wholesale price to a series of per ounce taxes, depending upon the type of product. For some types of product, this would be a tax increase, for others a tax decrease. Although we do not have complete detail on the amount of each type of product that is consumed in the state (current reporting forms do not require such detail) we believe the bill is overall close to revenue neutral for the 01-03 biennium. The current forecast for tobacco products is \$2.023 million for FY 02 and \$2.043 million for FY 03. This increase in forecasted revenue between the two years is primarily due to forecasted product price increases. Upon passage, SB 2408 would fix the tax on a per unit basis so future revenues would flucuate based on consumption only.
