1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact sections 54-03-01.5 and 54-03-20 of the North Dakota

2 Century Code, relating to legislative redistricting requirements and compensation of members

3 of the legislative assembly.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

5 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 54-03-01.5 of the 2001 Supplement to the North 6 Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

54-03-01.5. Legislative apportionment redistricting requirements. A legislative
 apportionment redistricting plan based on any census taken after 1989 1999 must meet the
 following requirements:

10	1.	The senate must consist of forty-nine members and the house must consist of
11		ninety-eight members.

- Except as provided in subsection 3, one senator and two representatives must be
 apportioned to each senatorial district. Representatives may be elected at large or
 from subdistricts, except representatives must be elected from subdistricts in every
- 15 senatorial district having a geographical area of three thousand square miles
- 16 [777000 hectares] or more. A representative elected from a subdistrict must be
- 17 <u>chosen by the qualified electors of the subdistrict and be a resident of the</u>
 18 subdistrict.
- Multimember senate districts providing for two senators and four representatives
 are authorized only when a proposed single member senatorial district includes a
 federal facility or federal installation, containing over two-thirds of the population of
 the proposed single member senatorial district.
- 23 4. Legislative districts and subdistricts must be compact and of contiguous territory.

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Legislative districts <u>and subdistricts</u> must be as nearly equal in population as is
 practicable. Population deviation from district to district <u>and subdistrict to</u>
 <u>subdistrict</u> must be kept at a minimum. The total population variance of all districts,
 and subdistricts if created, from the average district population may not exceed
 recognized constitutional limitations.

6 SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 54-03-20 of the 2001 Supplement to the North
7 Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

8 54-03-20. Compensation and expense reimbursement of members of the 9 legislative assembly. Each member of the legislative assembly of the state of North Dakota is 10 entitled to receive as compensation for services the sum of one hundred twenty-five dollars for 11 each calendar day during any organizational, special, or regular legislative session and for each 12 day that member attends a meeting of a legislative committee between the organizational 13 session and the regular session as authorized by legislative rule. Each member of the 14 legislative assembly is entitled to receive reimbursement for lodging, which may not exceed a 15 maximum of six hundred fifty dollars per calendar month for lodging in state, at the rates and in 16 the manner provided in section 44-08-04 for each calendar day during the period of any 17 organizational, special, or regular session. Members of the legislative assembly who receive 18 reimbursement for lodging are also entitled to reimbursement for travel for not to exceed one 19 round trip taken during any calendar week, or portion of a week, the legislative assembly is in 20 session, between their residences and the place of meeting of the legislative assembly, at the 21 rate provided for state employees with the additional limitation that reimbursement for travel by 22 common carrier may be only at the cost of coach fare and may not exceed one and one-half 23 times the amount the member would be entitled to receive as mileage reimbursement for travel 24 by motor vehicle. A member of the legislative assembly who does not receive reimbursement 25 for lodging and whose place of residence in the legislative district that the member represents is 26 not within the city of Bismarck is entitled to reimbursement at the rate provided for state 27 employees for necessary travel for not to exceed one round trip taken per day between the 28 residence and the place of meeting of the legislative assembly when it is in session and may 29 receive reimbursement for lodging at the place of meeting of the legislative assembly as 30 provided in section 44-08-04 for each calendar day for which round trip travel reimbursement is 31 not claimed, provided that the total reimbursement may not exceed six hundred fifty dollars per

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1 month. The amount to which each legislator is entitled must be paid following the

2 organizational session in December and following each month during a regular or special

3 session.

A day, or portion of a day, spent in traveling to or returning from an organizational,
special, or regular session or a legislative committee meeting must be included as a calendar
day during a legislative session or as a day of a legislative committee meeting for the purposes
of this section.

8 In addition, each member is entitled to receive during the term for which the member 9 was elected, as compensation for the execution of public duties during the biennium, the sum of 10 two hundred fifty dollars a month, which is payable every six months or monthly, at the 11 member's option. A member who is a senator from a senatorial district having a geographical 12 area of three thousand square miles [777000 hectares] or more is entitled to additional 13 compensation in an amount of up to one hundred dollars per month as determined by the 14 legislative council for the execution of public duties during the biennium. If a member dies or 15 resigns from office during the member's term, the member may be paid only the allowances 16 provided for in this section for the period for which the member was actually a member. The 17 majority and minority leaders of the house and senate and the chairman of the legislative 18 council, if the chairman is not a majority or minority leader, are each entitled to receive as 19 compensation, in addition to any other compensation or expense reimbursement provided by 20 law, the sum of two hundred fifty dollars per month during the biennium for their execution of 21 public duties.

Attendance at any organizational, special, or regular session of the legislative assembly by any member is a conclusive presumption of entitlement as set out in this section and compensation and expense allowances must be excluded from gross income for income tax purposes to the extent permitted for federal income tax purposes under section 127 of the Economic Recovery Tax Act of 1981 [Pub. L. 97-34; 95 Stat. 202; 26 U.S.C. 162(i)].
