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A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for a student achievement and teacher quality pilot project.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

## 4 SECTION 1. STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT AND TEACHER QUALITY PILOT PROJECT 5 - APPROPRIATION.

- There is appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$340,000, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, to the superintendent of public instruction for the purpose of funding a pilot project designed to enhance student achievement and teacher quality as provided in this section, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2003, and ending June 30, 2005.
- 2. The superintendent of public instruction shall select two recipients, based on an application process, for participation in a pilot project designed to enhance student achievement and teacher quality during the 2003-05 biennium as provided in this section. The recipients must be situated in different parts of the state.
- 3. In order to be eligible to participate in the pilot project as provided in this section, a recipient must:
  - a. (1) Be a school district having over two thousand five hundred students in average daily membership, or
    - (2) Be a consortium of school districts, provided the total number of students in average daily membership in the consortium exceeds two thousand five hundred;
  - b. Commit to develop and implement:
    - (1) A mentoring program for individuals in their first three years of teaching;

1 (2) A professional development program that supports individual teacher 2 improvement which is aligned to the recipient's student achievement 3 goals and which provides research-based strategies for teaching, 4 learning, and leadership; 5 (3)An evaluation program that establishes standards for teachers with 6 respect to content knowledge, planning and preparation for instruction, 7 instructional delivery, student assessment, classroom management, 8 and professional responsibilities, and that requires an annual review by 9 a team to determine adequate performance and eligibility for 10 advancement; and 11 (4) A teacher compensation package that recognizes four categories of 12 teachers from beginning to advanced and which sets the compensation 13 level for each category based on the individual teacher's ability to meet 14 or exceed the recipient's established standards for content knowledge, 15 planning and preparation for instruction, instructional delivery, student 16 assessment, classroom management, and professional responsibilities; 17 Contract with an individual who has the academic skills and managerial C. 18 experience necessary to achieve the purposes of this section; and 19 Present the contract required by subdivision c to a committee appointed by d. 20 the legislative council and obtain the approval of that committee. 21 4. The superintendent of public instruction shall forward to each recipient selected to 22 participate in the pilot project the sum of \$20,000 to cover the direct and indirect 23 expenses of the participation, including the cost of a contract required by 24 subdivision d of subsection 3. 25 5. If the superintendent of public instruction determines that a recipient selected to 26 participate in the pilot program has implemented a mentoring program, a 27 professional development program, and an evaluation program as required by 28 subsection 3 and if the recipient implements a teacher compensation package that 29 meets the requirements of subsection 3 no later than the beginning of the 2004-05 30 school year, the superintendent shall forward \$150,000 to the recipient for use in

funding the teacher compensation package.
