HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 3020

1 A concurrent resolution urging the United States Army Corps of Engineers to promote private 2 access to and private development on lands it owns and manages around Lake Sakakawea. 3 WHEREAS, the Pick-Sloan Project, as authorized by the Flood Control Act of 1944, as 4 amended, provides major flood control benefits, recreational benefits, water supply benefits. 5 hydropower benefits, and navigational benefits for the downstream states of Iowa, Nebraska, 6 Missouri, and Kansas through construction of large reservoirs in states lying upstream from 7 these states; and 8 WHEREAS, the Pick-Sloan Project reservoirs have been in place for many years, thus 9 providing the states downstream from the Missouri River Basin all the benefits promised in the 10 Pick-Sloan Project; and 11 WHEREAS, construction of facilities under the Pick-Sloan Project has, to date, resulted 12 in over \$16.7 billion of flood protection to downstream interests and has allowed these 13 downstream interests to develop the original floodplain of the Missouri River for industrial, 14 municipal, and agricultural uses; and 15 WHEREAS, under the Pick-Sloan Project, North Dakota sacrificed over 550,000 acres 16 of land which has meant the permanent loss of 2,641 jobs, \$45 million of annual personal 17 income, and \$131 million of annual gross business volume; and 18 WHEREAS, most of the land surrounding Lake Sakakawea, which was created by 19 Garrison Dam, is owned by the federal government and managed by the United States Army 20 Corps of Engineers; and 21 WHEREAS, promoting private access and private development of this land would 22 enhance this resource for the citizens of North Dakota; 23 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES

OF NORTH DAKOTA, THE SENATE CONCURRING THEREIN:

- That the Fifty-seventh Legislative Assembly urges the United States Army Corps of
 Engineers to promote private access to and private development on lands it owns and manages
 around Lake Sakakawea; and
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Secretary of State forward copies of this
