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



Sen. Heitkamp: Introduced SB 2237. Stated a that the 4-H clubs sponsor an event the "Twist of Fate" meant to teach handicapped youth how to hunt. They have a legal problem allowing blind individuals to hunt. This bill would create a special license that would allow blind individuals to experience the joys of hunting safely.

Rep. DeKrey: Why are they limted to 1 deer.

Sen. Heitkamp: I think that may be an organizational situation

Rep. Hanson: There is a law that allows the blind to get a license but another person shoots.

Do they shoot themselves.

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Sen. Heitkamp: My interpretation is that they would actually shoot.
