## ENGROSSED SENATE BILL NO. 2031

- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 15.1-21-02 of the North Dakota Century Code,
- 2 relating to required units for approved high schools; and to provide an effective date.

## 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 4 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 15.1-21-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
- 6 15.1-21-02. High schools Required units.
- In order to be approved by the superintendent of public instruction, each public and nonpublic high school shall make available to each student:
- 9 4. a. Four units of English: language arts;
- 10 2. b. Three Four units of mathematics:
- 11 3. c. Four units of science.;
- 4. <u>d.</u> Three Four units of social studies, including one of world history and one of United States history, both of which must emphasize geography.
- 14 5. e. One One-half unit of health and during each school year;
- 15 f. One-half unit of physical education- during each school year;
- 16 G. g. One unit of Two units of fine arts, one of which must be music.;
- 7. Any six units selected from business education, economics and the free enterprise
  system, foreign language, American sign language, and vocational courses
  including family and consumer sciences, agriculture, business and office
  technology, marketing, diversified occupations, trade and industrial education,
  technology education, and health careers. The vocational courses may be offered
  through cooperative arrangements approved by the state board for vocational and
  technical education.
- h. Two units of the same foreign language;

3	<u>2.</u>	Each unit which must be made available under subsection 1 must meet or exceed		
4		the state content standards.		
5	<u>3.</u>	For purposes of this section, unless the context otherwise requires:		
6		<u>a.</u>	<u>"Elec</u>	tive" means a unit not required by the school district for graduation.
7		<u>b.</u>	<u>"Mak</u>	e available" means that:
8			<u>(1)</u>	Each public high school and nonpublic high school shall allow students
9				to select units from a list that includes at least all the units provided in
10				subsection 1;
11			<u>(2)</u>	If a student selects a unit from the list required by subsection 1, the
12				public high school or the nonpublic high school shall provide the unit to
13				the student; and
14			<u>(3)</u>	The unit may be provided to the student through any delivery method
15				not contrary to state law and may include classroom or individual
16				instruction and distance learning options, including interactive video,
17				computer instruction, correspondence courses, and postsecondary
18				enrollment under chapter 15.1-25.
19	<u>4.</u>	The board of a school district may not impose any fees or charges upon a student		
20		for t	he pro	ovision of or participation in units as provided in this section, other than
21		the	fees p	ermitted by section 15.1-09-36.
22	<u>5.</u>	If in order to meet the minimum requirements of this section a school district		
23		includes academic courses offered by a postsecondary institution under chapter		
24		15.1-25, the school district shall:		
25		<u>a.</u>	Pay a	all costs of the student's attendance, except those fees that are
26			perm	issible under section 15.1-09-36; and
27		<u>b.</u>	Trans	sport the student to and from the location at which the course is offered
28			or pr	ovide mileage reimbursement to the student if transportation is provided
29			by th	e student or the student's family.
30	<u>6.</u>	The requirements of this section do not apply to alternative high schools or		
31		alternative high school education programs.		

1 **SECTION 2. EFFECTIVE DATE.** This Act becomes effective on July 1, 2004.
