## FIRST ENGROSSMENT with House Amendments ENGROSSED SENATE BILL NO. 2048

- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 20.1-03 and a new subsection to
- 2 section 20.1-03-12 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to resident waterfowl licenses;
- 3 and to amend and reenact sections 20.1-03-07.1 and 20.1-08-04 of the North Dakota Century
- 4 Code, relating to a limitation on the number of nonresident waterfowl hunters.

## 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

6 **SECTION 1.** A new section to chapter 20.1-03 of the North Dakota Century Code is 7 created and enacted as follows:

Resident fall waterfowl license. A resident may not hunt waterfowl in the fall season
without obtaining a resident fall waterfowl hunting license. A resident may not obtain a resident
fall waterfowl license unless the resident obtains a habitat restoration stamp for each license.
SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 20.1-03-07.1 of the North Dakota Century Code
in amended and respected as follows:

12 is amended and reenacted as follows:

## 13 **20.1-03-07.1.** Nonresident waterfowl hunting license required.

- 141.Except as provided in sections 20.1-03-07.2 and 20.1-03-07.3, a nonresident may15not hunt waterfowl unless that person first obtains a nonresident waterfowl hunting16license, in addition to a nonresident small game hunting license.
- The nonresident may obtain a license that entitles the nonresident to hunt before
   November first and a license to hunt after October thirty-first or both. The
- 19 nonresident is entitled to purchase only one nonresident waterfowl hunting license
- 20 to hunt before November first per year and only one license after October
- 21 <u>thirty-first per year.</u>
- 3. The nonresident waterfowl hunting license to hunt before November first entitles
   the nonresident to hunt waterfowl for fourteen consecutive days in one of four
   zones or during any two periods of seven consecutive days each in a specified

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1		zone of the four zones during each period. The first zone is the portion of this
2		state north of a line beginning at the intersection of the Red River and state
3		highway 200, proceeding west along state highway 200 to the intersection of
4		United States interstate 29, proceeding north along United States interstate 29 to
5		state highway 200, proceeding west along state highway 200 to the intersection
6		with United States highway 52, proceeding along United States highway 52 until its
7		intersection with United States highway 2, and proceeding along United States
8		highway 2 to its intersection with the Montana border; the second zone is the
9		portion of this state south of the first zone, north of United States interstate 94, and
10		east of a line beginning at the intersection of United States highway 83 and United
11		States interstate 94, proceeding north along United States highway 83 to the
12		border of the first zone; the third zone is the portion of this state south of the
13		second zone and east of a line beginning at the intersection of United States
14		highway 83 and the South Dakota border, proceeding north along United States
15		highway 83 to the intersection of United States interstate 94; and the fourth zone is
16		the portion of this state south of the first zone and west of the second and third
17		zones. The governor, in the governor's proclamation, shall set the number of
18		licenses which may be issued for each zone based on the hunting pressure
19		concept. The governor shall determine the manner in which the licenses are
20		issued.
21	<u>4.</u>	The nonresident waterfowl hunting license to hunt after October thirty-first entitles
22		the nonresident to hunt waterfowl for any period of fourteen consecutive days, any
23		<del>period of</del> seven consecutive days <del>, or any two periods of seven consecutive days</del>
24		each. A license authorizing the fourteen day hunting period allows hunting in a
25		specified waterfowl hunting zone. A license authorizing one 7-day hunting period
26		allows hunting statewide. A license authorizing two 7-day hunting periods allows
27		hunting in a specified zone during each period. The governor, in the governor's
28		proclamation, shall specify various waterfowl hunting zones for which nonresident
29		waterfowl hunting licenses will be available, and may specify the number of

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1		hunting license per year The total number of nonresident waterfowl hunting				
2		licenses issued after October thirty-first is fifteen percent of the licenses allowed to				
3		be issued before November first. The governor shall determine the manner in				
4		which the licenses are issued.				
5	<u>5.</u>	The governor shall determine the total number of nonresident waterfowl hunting				
6		licenses issued before November first by subtracting the number of resident				
7		waterfowl hunters of the previous fall season from the targeted hunting pressure				
8		for the current season, dividing the difference by the current hunting pressure				
9		factor, and increasing the quotient by forty percent. Notwithstanding the number				
10		determined by the formula, at least fifteen thousand nonresident waterfowl hunting				
11		licenses must be made available in any year. Targeted hunting pressure is the				
12		sum obtained by adding thirty-one thousand three hundred twenty-six and the				
13		product resulting from multiplying two thousand one hundred twenty-six				
14		ten-thousandths times the wetland index. The wetland index is the sum of current				
15		season wetlands counted during the May waterfowl breeding ground survey of				
16		semipermanent wetlands, permanent wetlands, manmade impoundments,				
17		dugouts, and permanent streams, multiplied by the current year expansion factor				
18		to provide a statewide index. The current hunting pressure factor is the average of				
19		the five most recent estimates of the daily average number of ducks harvested per				
20		nonresident hunter divided by the daily number of ducks harvested per resident				
21		hunter based on annual department hunter harvest surveys.				
22	<u>6.</u>	If there is an early fall duck season, the governor, in the governor's proclamation,				
23		shall prohibit a nonresident duck hunter from hunting for the first seven days of the				
24		season on land owned or private land enrolled by the department for the purpose				
25		of hunting or on land for which the department pays in lieu of tax payments.				
26	SECTION 3. A new subsection to section 20.1-03-12 of the North Dakota Century					
27	27 Code is created and enacted as follows:					
28		For a resident fall waterfowl license, one dollar.				
29	SECTION 4. AMENDMENT. Section 20.1-08-04 of the North Dakota Century Code is					
30	30 amended and reenacted as follows:

10	2.	The	governor in the governor's proclamation or order may determine the number of		
11		resic	lent and nonresident big game licenses to be issued for the taking of each		
12		spec	ties, age, or sex. When a limited number of big game licenses or special		
13		perm	nits are to be issued, the governor shall by order or proclamation declare the		
14		manner of issuance of the licenses and permits. The governor may by			
15		proclamation or order determine the time period for which a recipient of a big game			
16		licen	se or special permit obtained by lottery is ineligible to apply for the same type		
17		of lic	ense or special permit.		
18	3.	In ac	dition to the regular big game hunting licenses, the governor, by order or		
19		proc	lamation, may authorize the issuance of special permits to hunt big game in		
20		certa	ain restricted areas. Special permits issued under this subsection must be		
21		issue	ed in strict compliance with the governor's order or proclamation. When acting		
22		purs	uant to this subsection, the governor shall designate in the proclamation:		
23		a.	The species of big game which can be hunted.		
24		b.	The boundaries of the restricted area.		
25		C.	The number of special permits to be issued.		
26		d.	The procedure to determine which applicants should receive the special		
27			permits.		
28		e.	The manner and times in which the big game may be taken.		
29		Spec	cial permits issued under this subsection shall be issued in strict compliance		
30		with	the governor's proclamation.
