- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 53-01 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to mixed fighting style competitions; and to amend and reenact sections
- 3 53-01-02, 53-01-03, 53-01-07, and 53-01-17 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the
- 4 regulation of mixed fighting style competitions.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- SECTION 1. A new section to chapter 53-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows:
- 8 <u>Definition of mixed fighting style competition.</u> As used in this chapter, "mixed
- 9 <u>fighting style competition" means an exhibition or a contest subject to any applicable limitations</u>
- 10 <u>set forth in rules established under section 53-01-07, in which participants use a combination of</u>
- 11 techniques from different martial arts, boxing, kickboxing, wrestling, and grappling.
- 12 **SECTION 2. AMENDMENT.** Section 53-01-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is
- 13 amended and reenacted as follows:
- 14 53-01-02. Administration by secretary of state Appointment of athletic advisory
- 15 **board.** The secretary of state shall act as state athletic commissioner and administer this
- 16 chapter. The secretary of state may appoint an athletic advisory board to assist and advise the
- 17 secretary of state in matters relating to the regulation of boxing, kickboxing, mixed fighting style
- 18 <u>competitions</u>, and sparring. The secretary of state shall define the duties of the board.
- 19 Members of the board shall serve without compensation, except for reimbursement for actual
- 20 and necessary expenses at the same rate as allowed state employees incurred in performing
- 21 their official duties.
- 22 **SECTION 3. AMENDMENT.** Section 53-01-03 of the North Dakota Century Code is
- 23 amended and reenacted as follows:

- **53-01-03. Restrictions.** The secretary of state may not <u>promote</u>, directly or indirectly, <u>promote</u> any boxing, <u>kickboxing</u>, <u>mixed fighting style competition</u>, or sparring exhibition, engage in the managing of any boxer et. <u>kickboxer</u>, <u>or mixed style fighter</u>, or be interested in any manner in the proceeds from any boxing, <u>kickboxing</u>, <u>mixed fighting style competition</u>, or sparring exhibition.
 - **SECTION 4. AMENDMENT.** Section 53-01-07 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
- **53-01-07. Duties of state athletic commissioner.** The secretary of state shall supervise all boxing, kickboxing, <u>mixed fighting style competitions</u>, or sparring exhibitions held in the state and may:
 - Adopt <u>Issue</u> rules governing the conduct of boxing, kickboxing, and sparring these
 exhibitions <u>which must be consistent with chapter 53-01 and published in</u>
 accordance with chapter 28-32.
 - 2. Establish license fees for all boxers, kickboxers, boxing and kickboxing promoters, managers, judges, timekeepers, cornerpersons, knockdown counters, matchmakers, and referees by rule license fees for individuals and organizations associated with these exhibitions.
 - 3. Establish by rule a fee based on the percentage of gross revenues from any boxing, kickboxing, or sparring exhibition held in this state to pay for the expenses of members of the athletic advisory board according to this chapter. A fee established under this subsection may not exceed one five percent of the gross revenues of the exhibition from any and all sources including cable television and pay-per-view telecasts of the event, exclusive of any federal tax thereon.
- **SECTION 5. AMENDMENT.** Section 53-01-17 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
- **53-01-17.** Exhibitions also governed by local ordinance. Boxing, kickboxing, or sparring exhibitions may not be held in cities in which such contests or exhibitions are declared illegal by ordinance. All boxing, kickboxing, mixed fighting style competitions, or sparring exhibitions held in any city in this state must be held in conformity with the ordinances of the city in addition to the requirements under this chapter.
